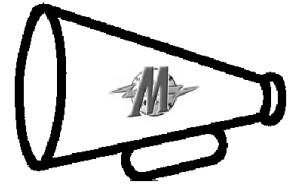

This is the second and final edition of the Megaphone that I have created based just on the Kawaga competition.

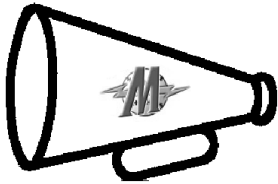
## 11A Hockey Comeback by David Mizock

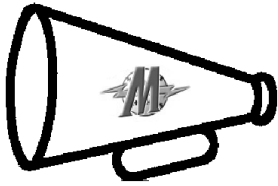
### Newcomb IID by Drew Hollins

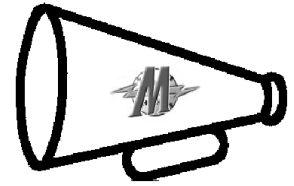
### Football by David Munzer 11C

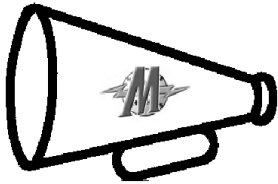
### 16B Football by Jacob Barstack
