

terrific season at C.M.








STAFF HOOPS TRIUMPHS OVER TIMBERLANE







The Menominee counselor Volleyball team had a difficult task considering we had to travel to Deerhorn for the best of five competition.


In the early stages we didn't work together properly, and we lost a close first game 15-13 - despite amazing efforts by Ross Allen and Steve Schlosser.




10 1A BASKETBALL TROUNCES DEERHORN



12C SOFTBALL TAKES BIG GAME


On Wednesday, August 1st, the 12C Softball team of Menominee went against the 12C Softball team of Kawaga, on Diamond 2 at Menominee.


The 4.5 mile course was completed by over thirty entrants and was won by Booch. The rather rough road surface made the course a little difficult for the roller blader, VJ.


Last night's Five Year Night was an exciting experience for all new and old Five Year Club Members.






