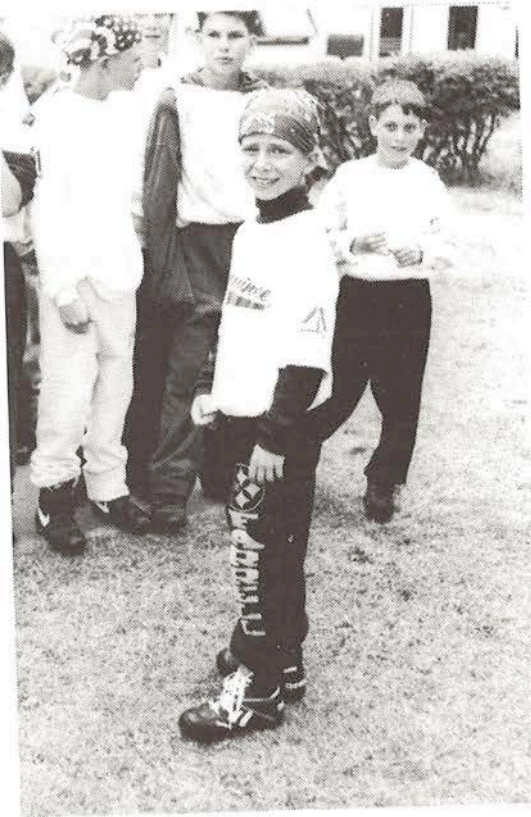


## 13 And Over Tennis Responds To Invitational

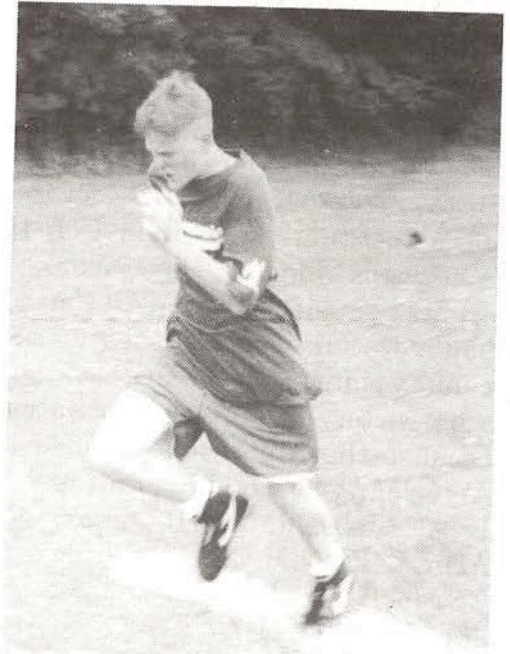


## C.M. HOSTS FIRST INDIVIDUAL SPORTS INVITATIONAL

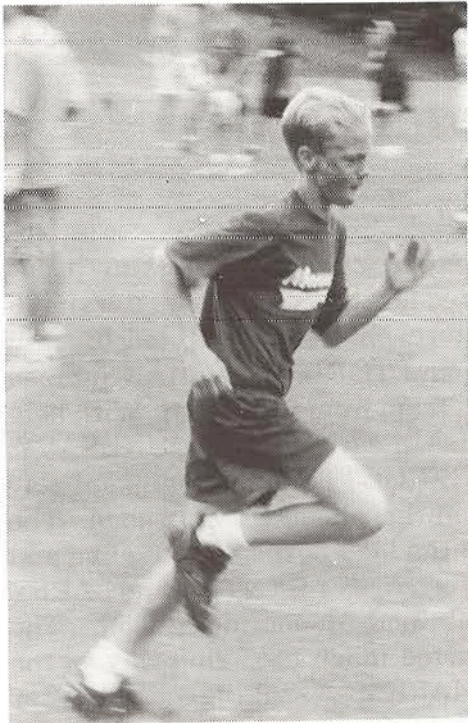

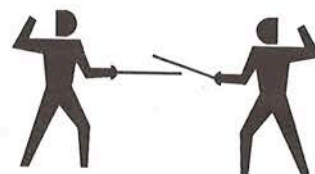

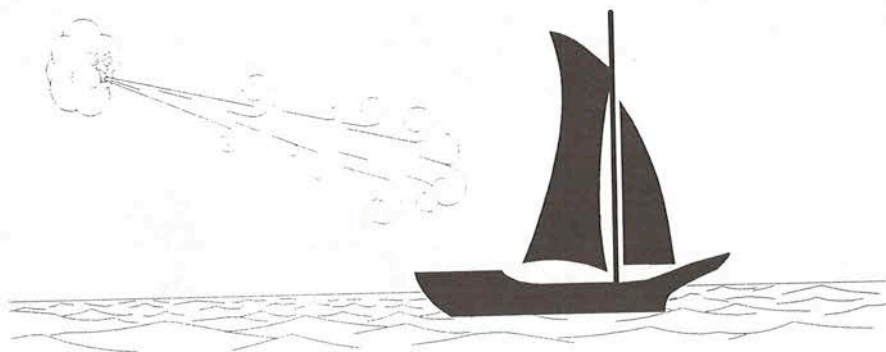
## Teamwork leads To C.M. 2 Blowout

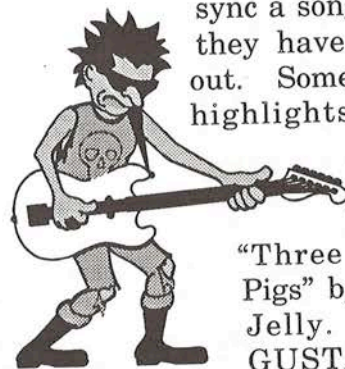

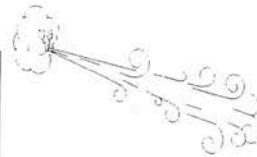

The evening passed smoothly on the amiable tracks of conversation and laughter between the campers.

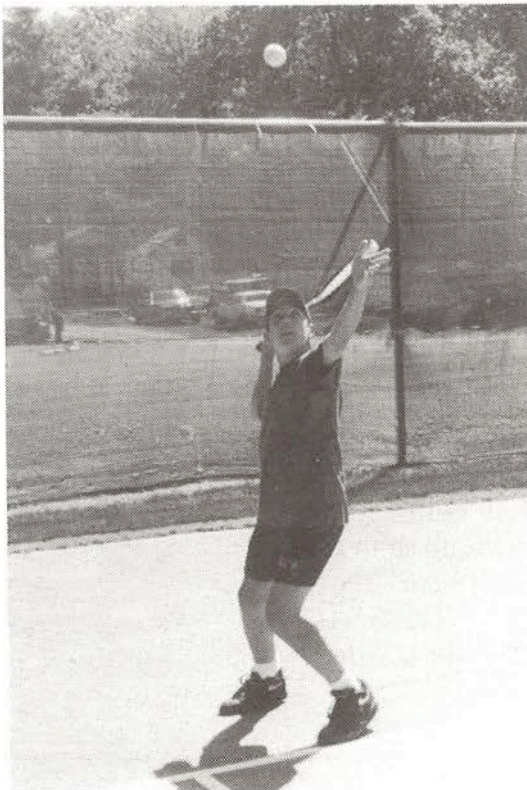

## BIRCH KNOLL VISITS DISNEYLAND "CM STYLE"

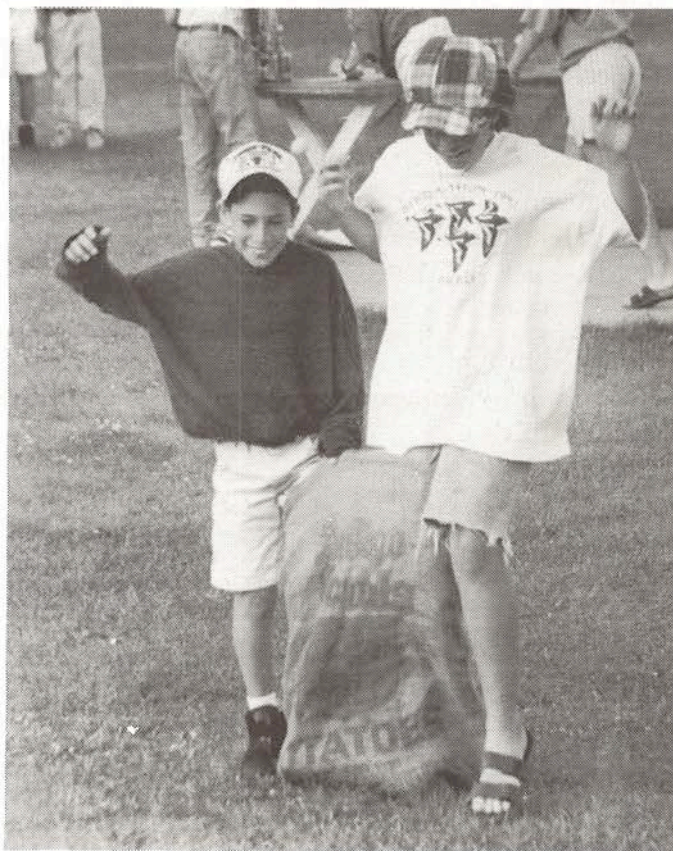

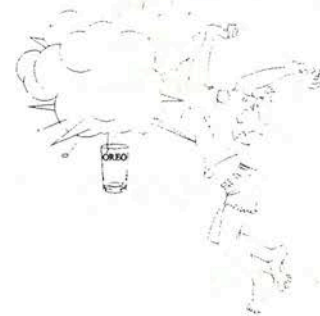
## Trip to Peck's Wildwood Proves to be Messy for Hank

Under windless conditions, and with the course being shortened mid-race, our Menominee team showed great wisdom and patience. Camp Menominee should be proud!

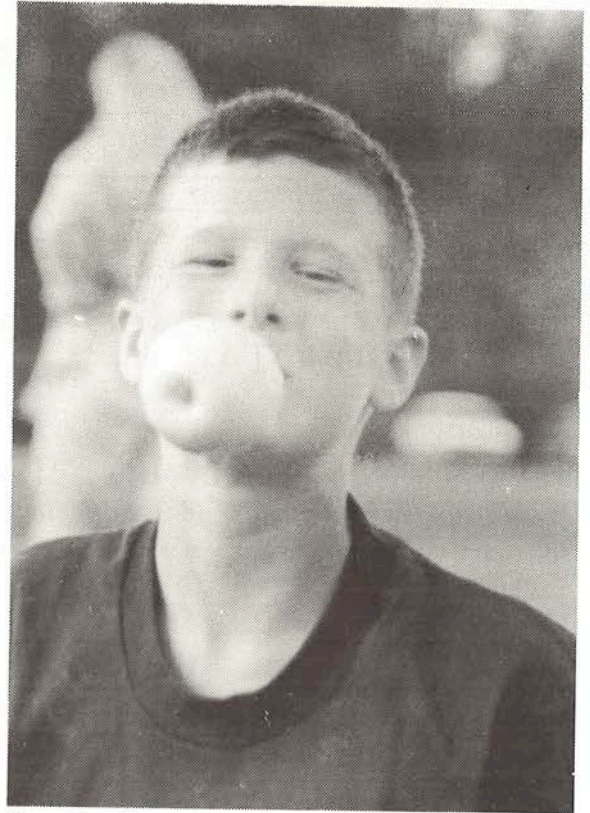


## Menominee And Agawak Enjoy Fairy Tale Social

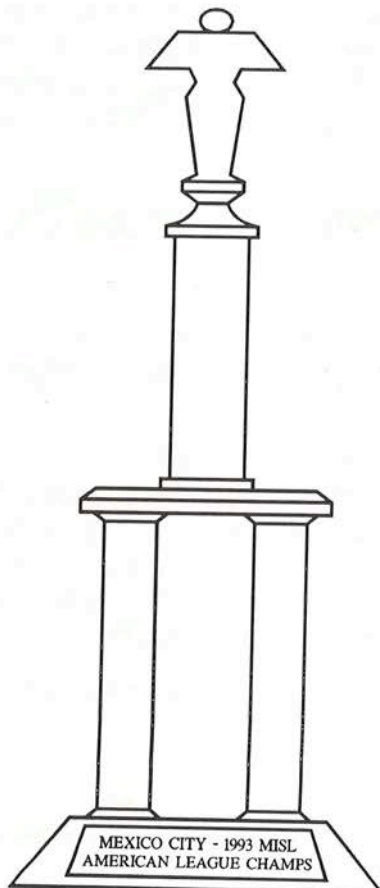

## M.B.A. CHAMPIONSHIP PLAYOFFS -A HUGE SUCCESS-

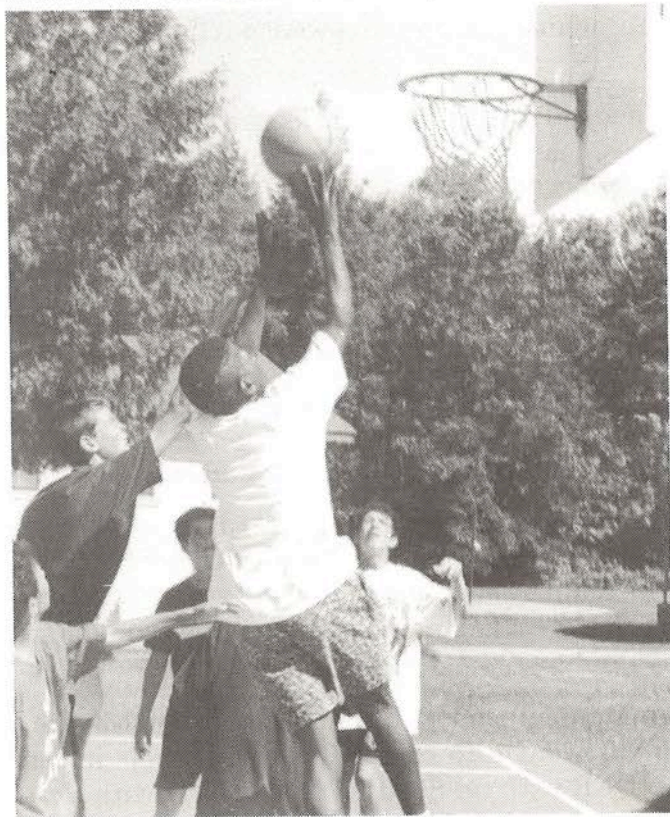

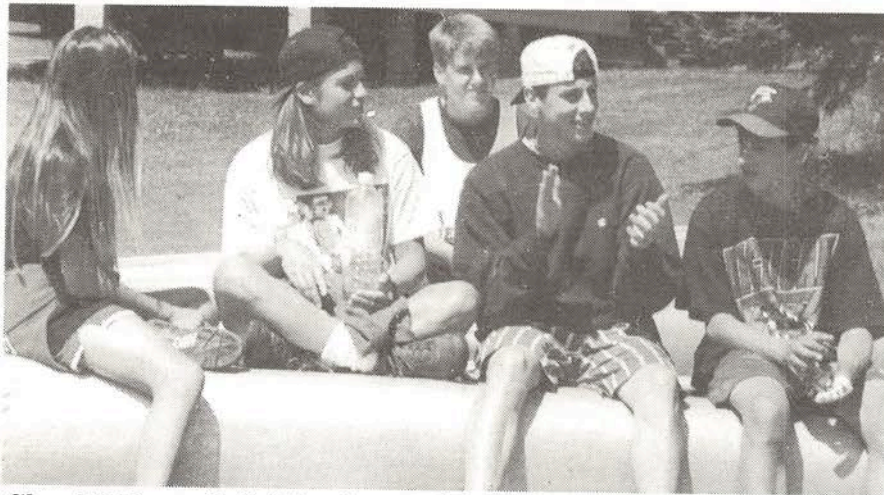
The First Ever Northwoods Olympics Awesome Gets Local TV Coverage

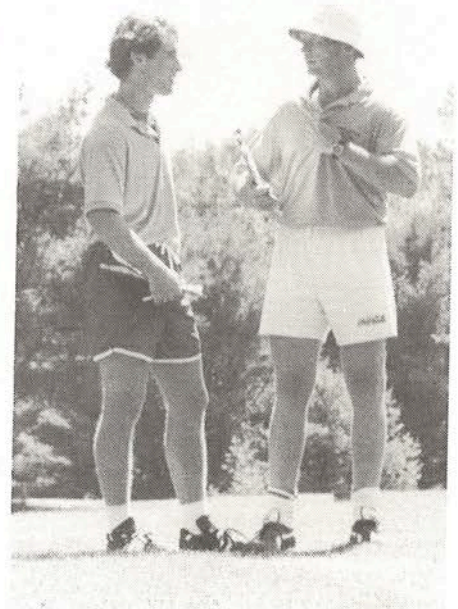

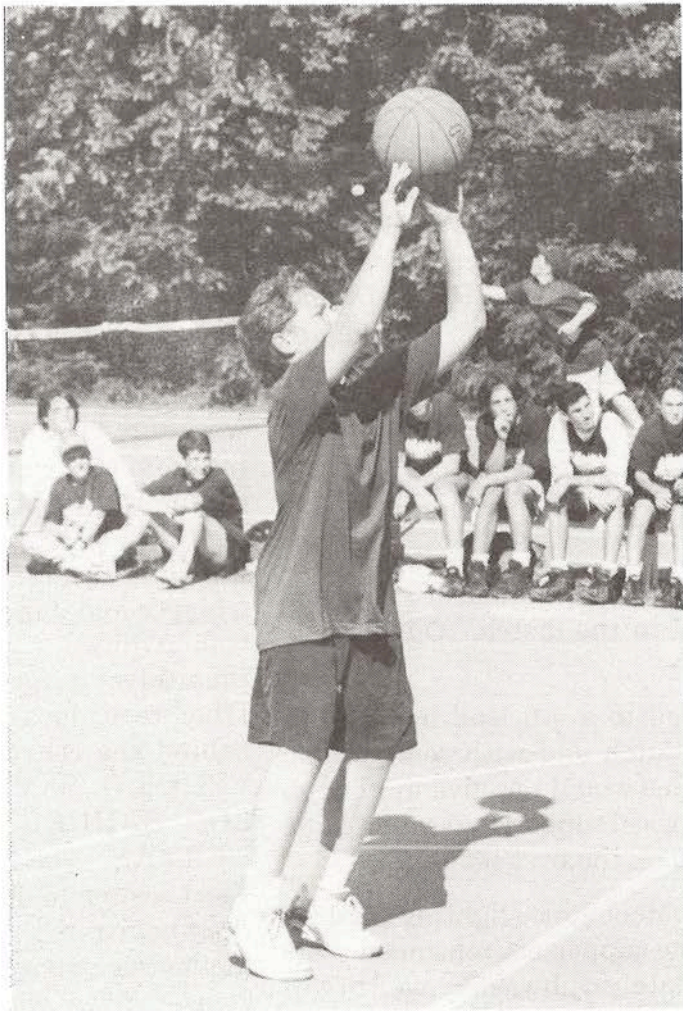


## JUNIORS BURST OUT WITH SONGS

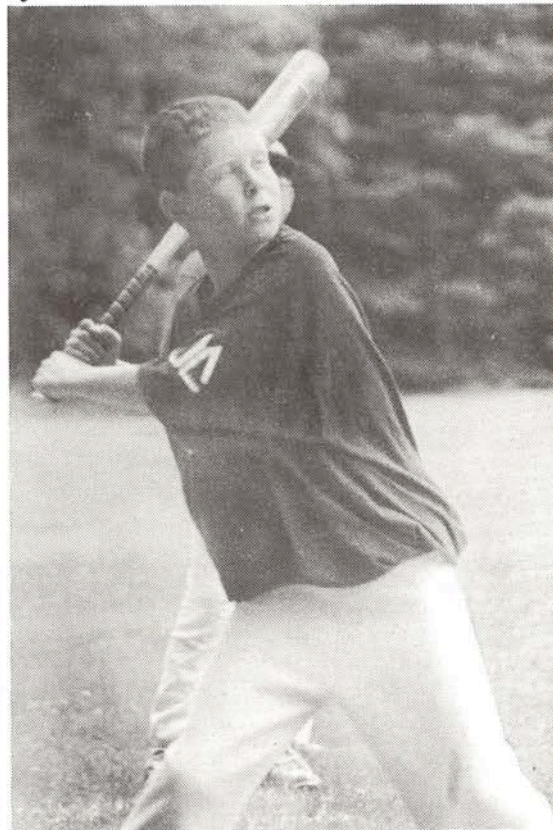

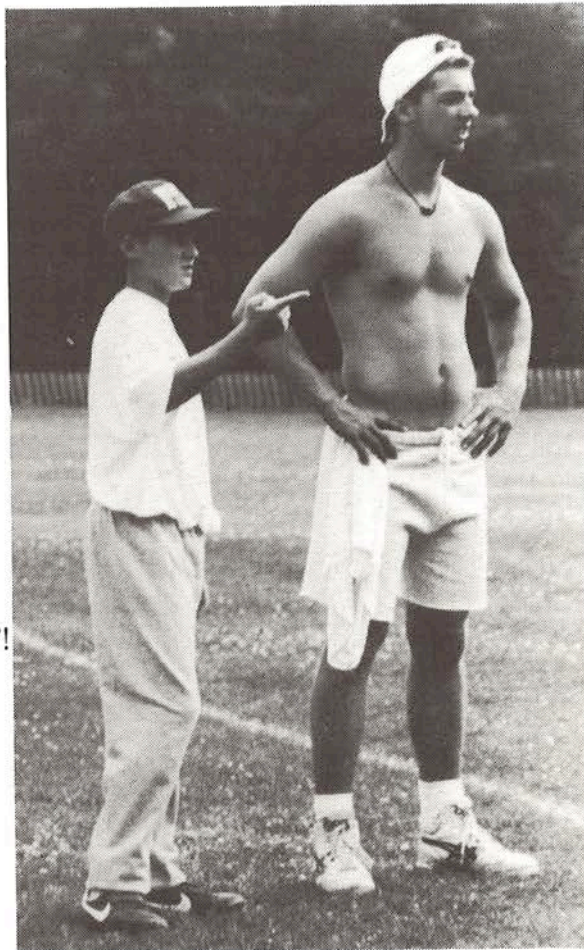

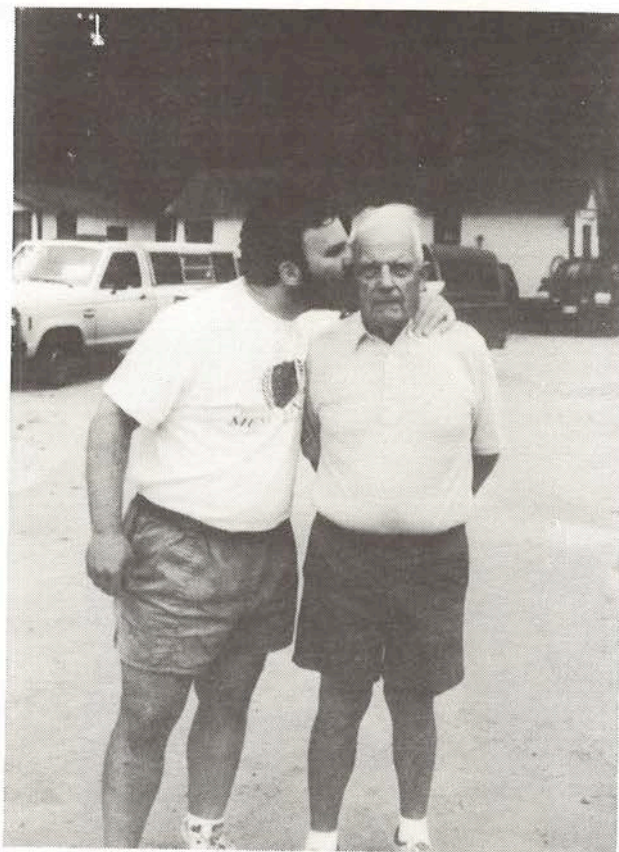


## Decade Club and Glenn's 25 Years

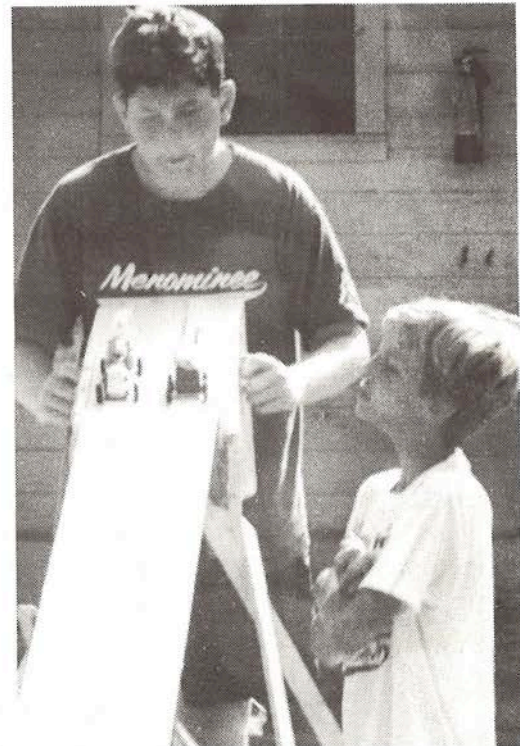

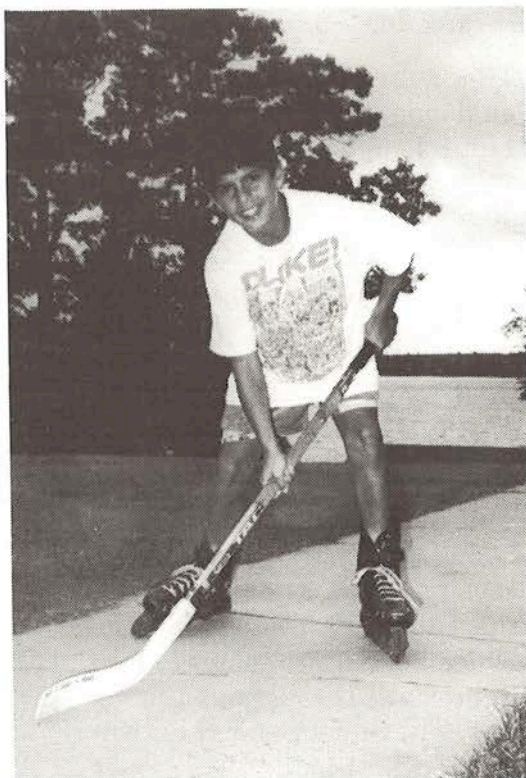

## BANQUET FEAST CLOSES SEASON OF GREAT EATIN'

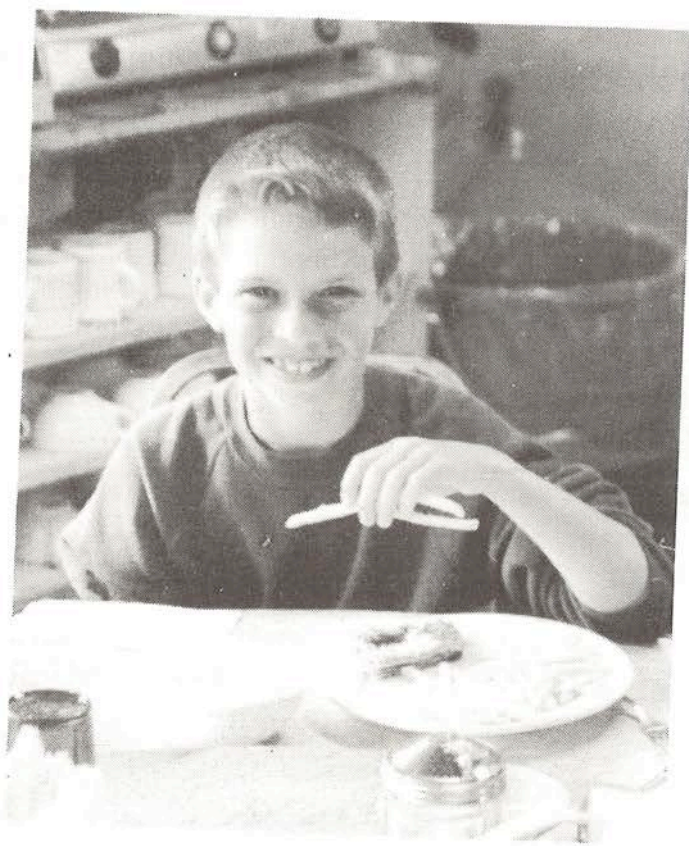
