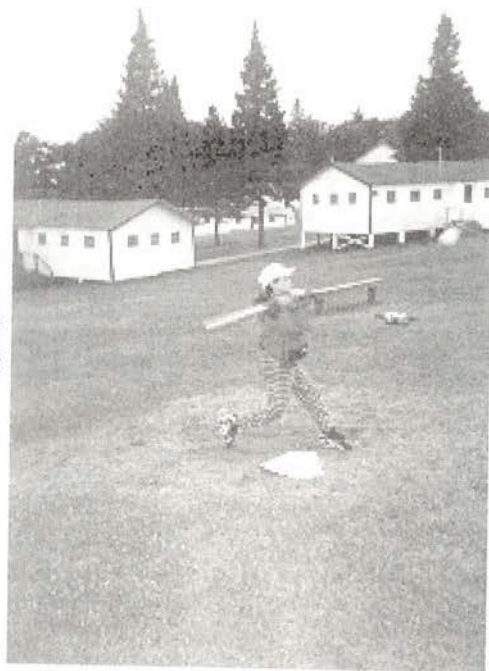

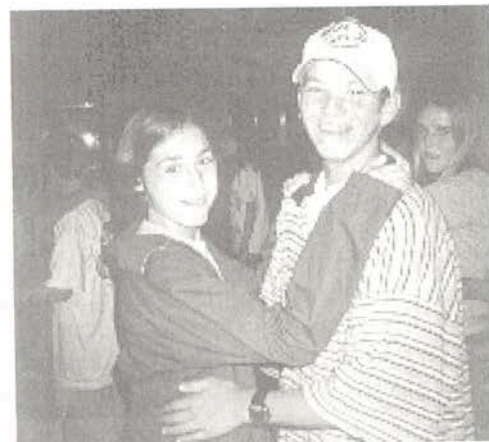

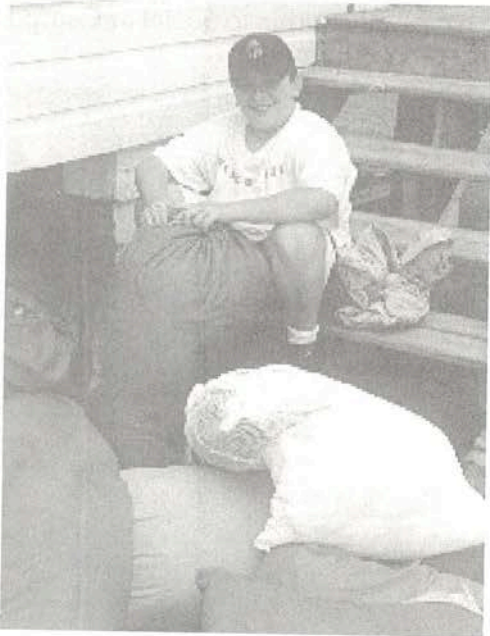

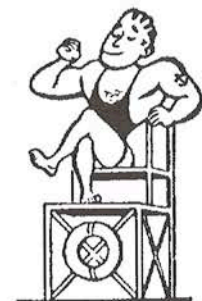
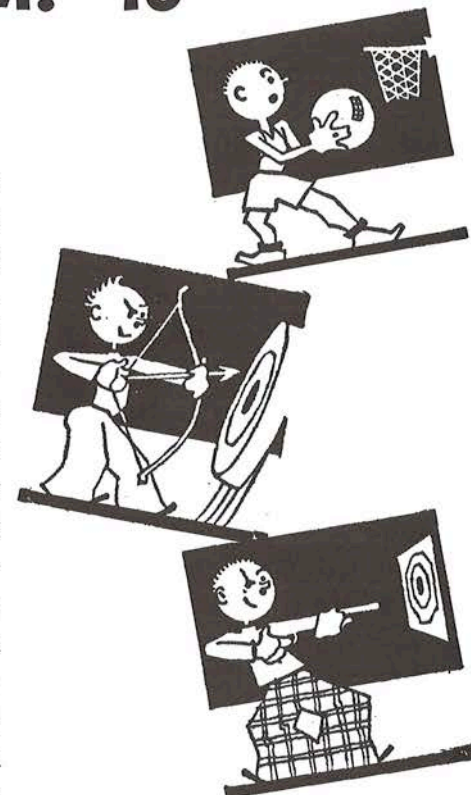
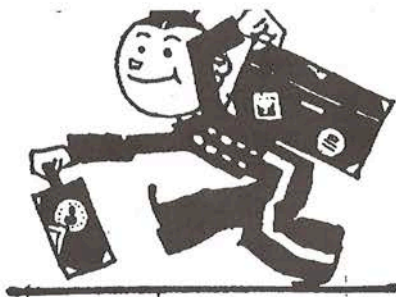
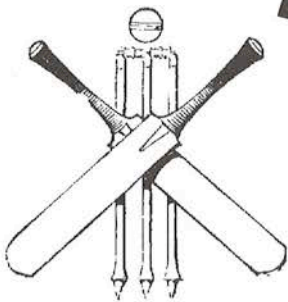


A Full Day Opens C.M. '96

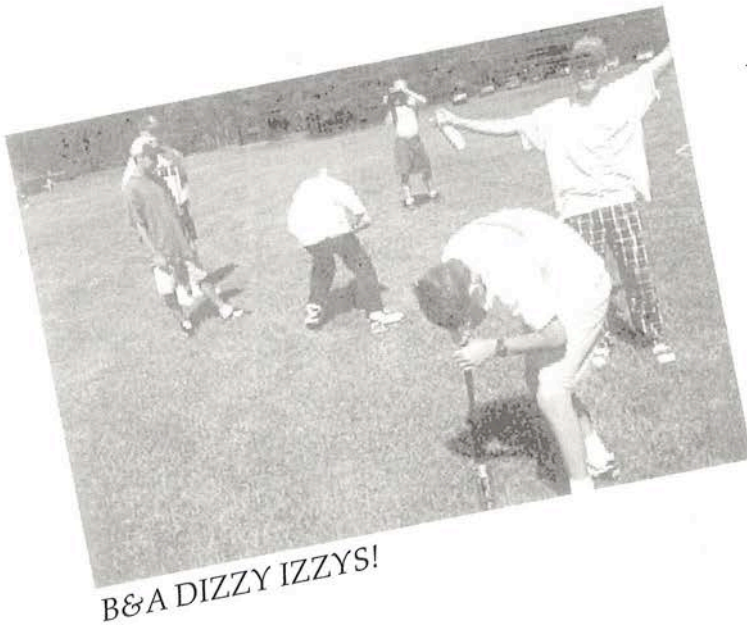

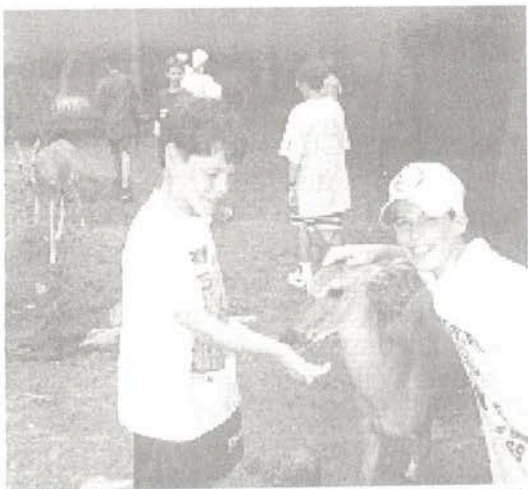
13 YEAR OLDS TRAVERSE TO THE DELLS

Overall, our skiers did very well with BRAD ROSS being our best by completing 3 buoys. All our skiers gave their best effort and showed good sportsmanship.

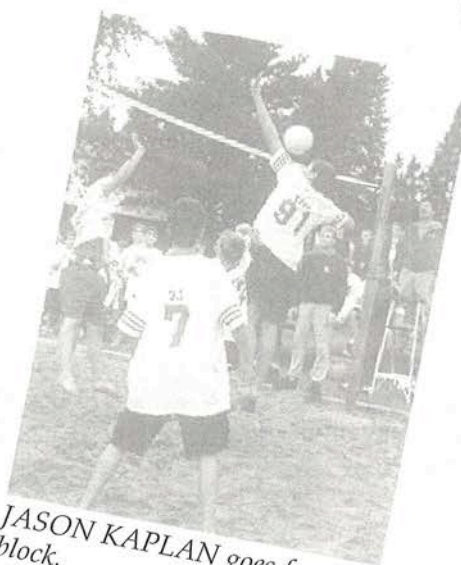

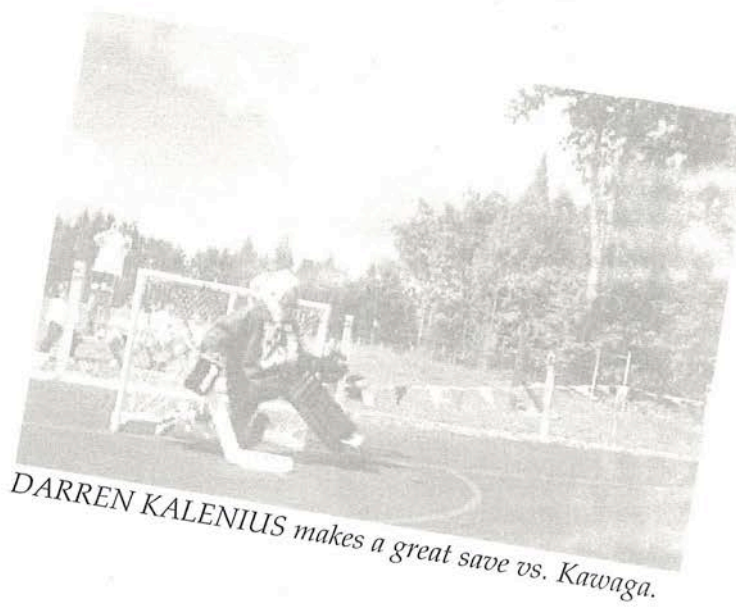

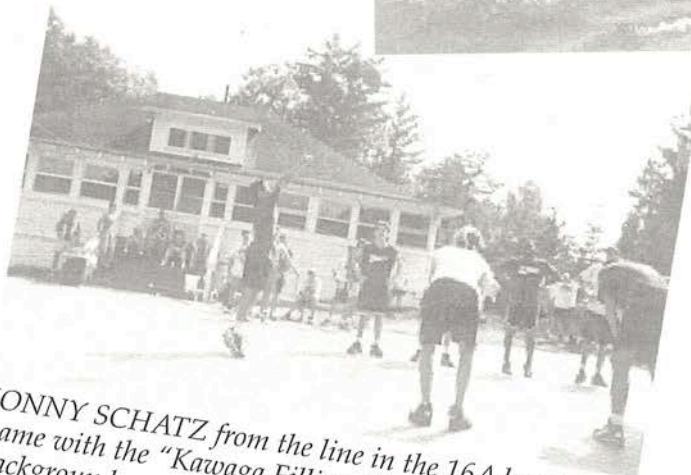

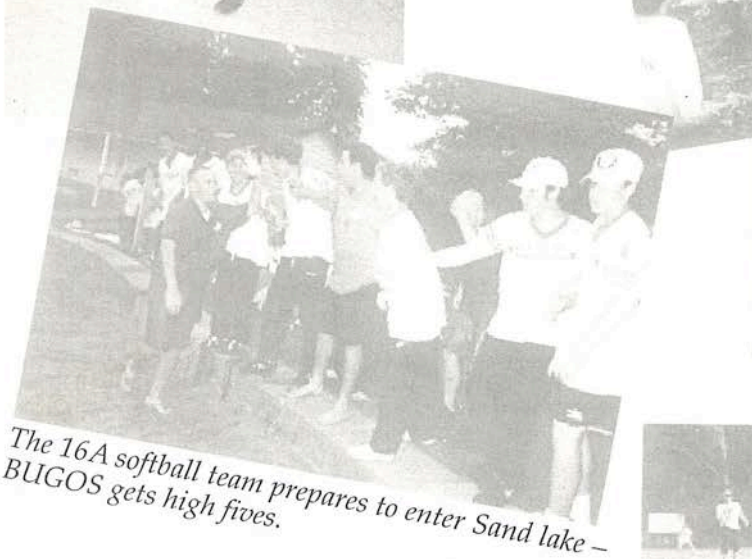

Menominee side. Great saves throughout the game by TEDDY ADATTO supported well by MIKE GORSKY, really inspired the Menominee hopes.

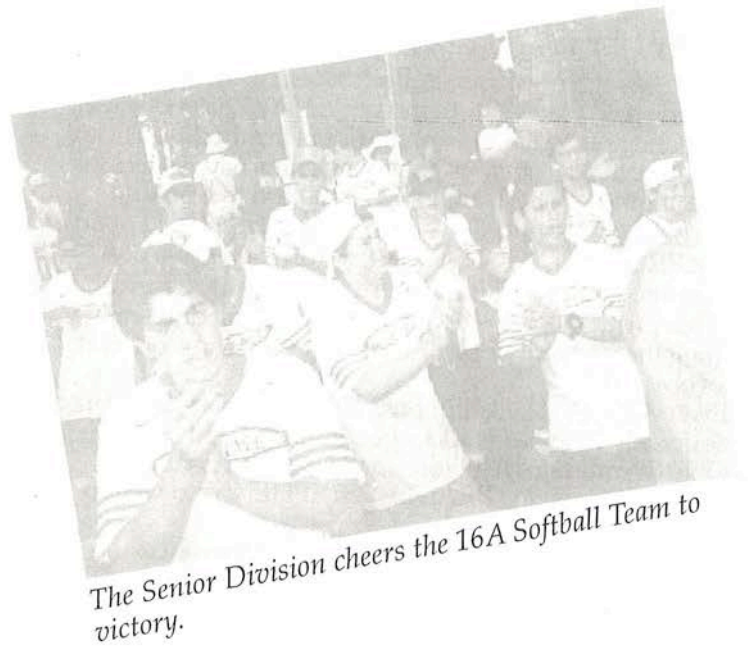
The pressure finally resulted in the equalizer

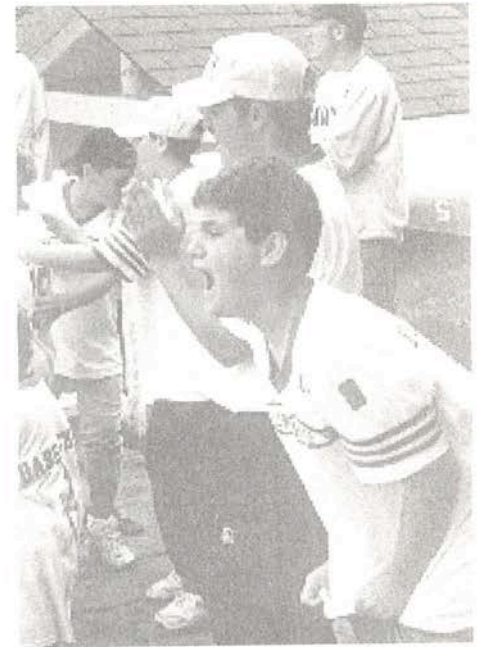

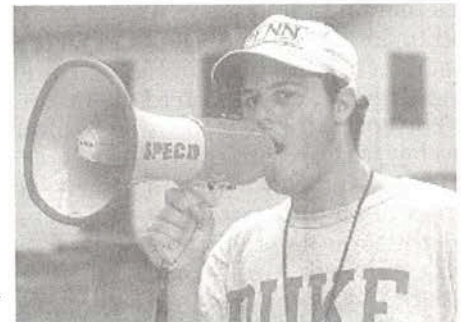

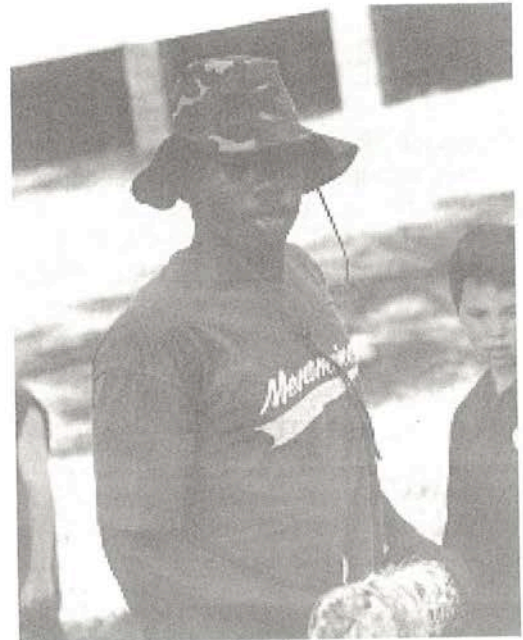

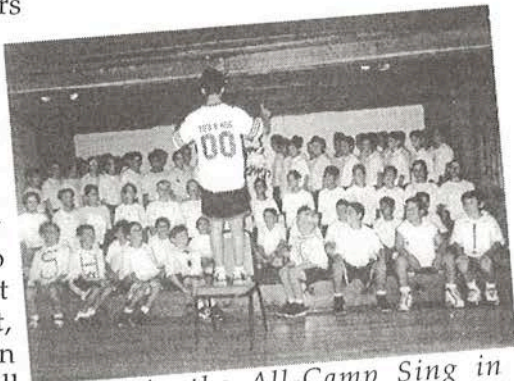

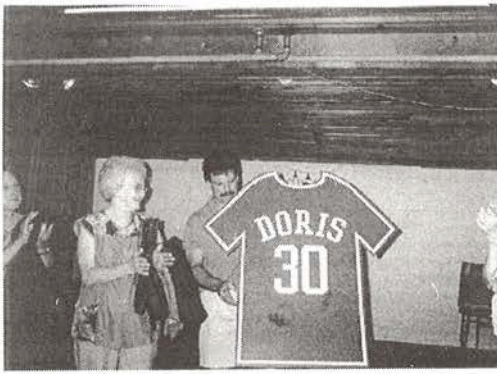
