As you read through these pages of The 1997 Megaphone Annual, remember how special the summer was and how special being part of Menominee is.

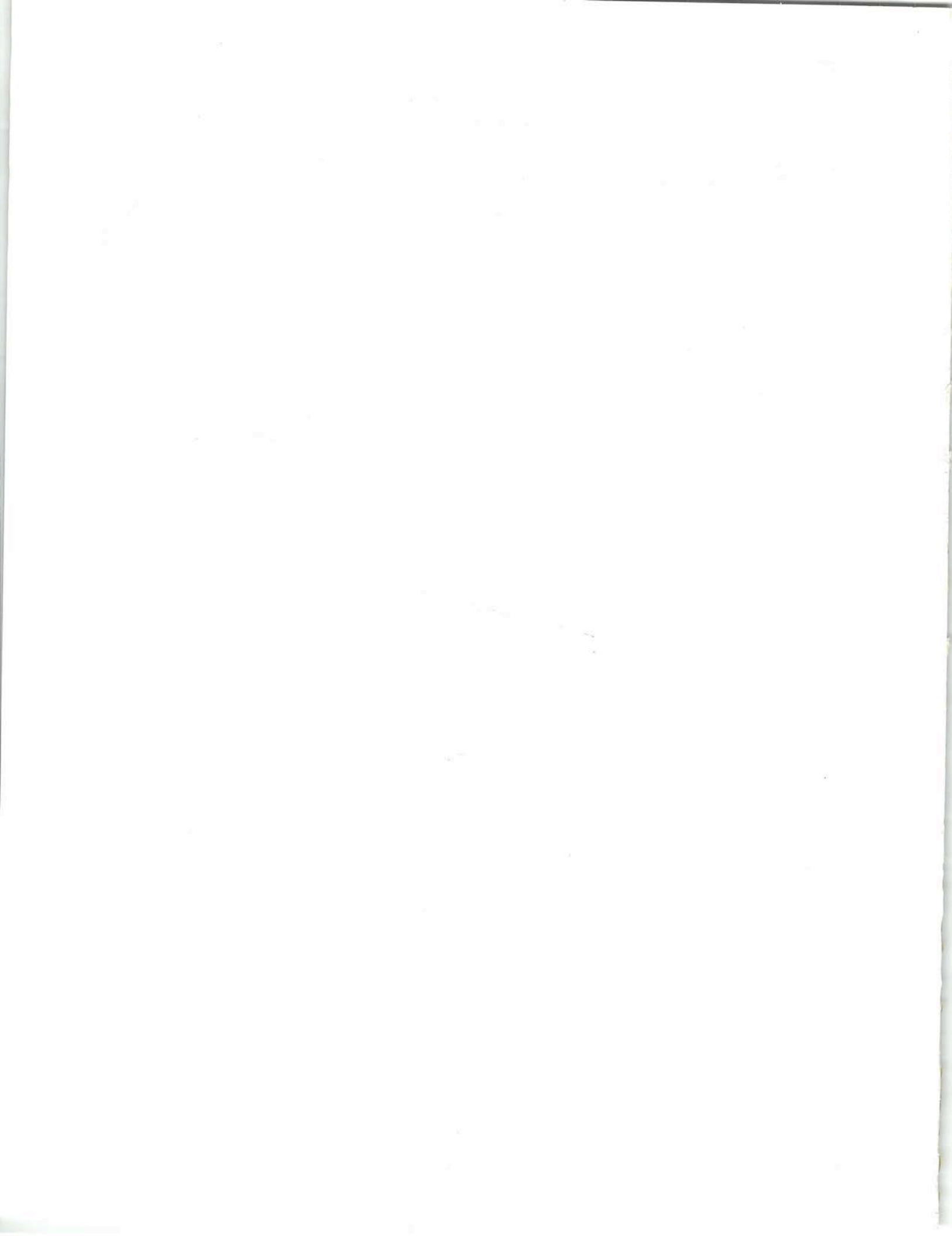

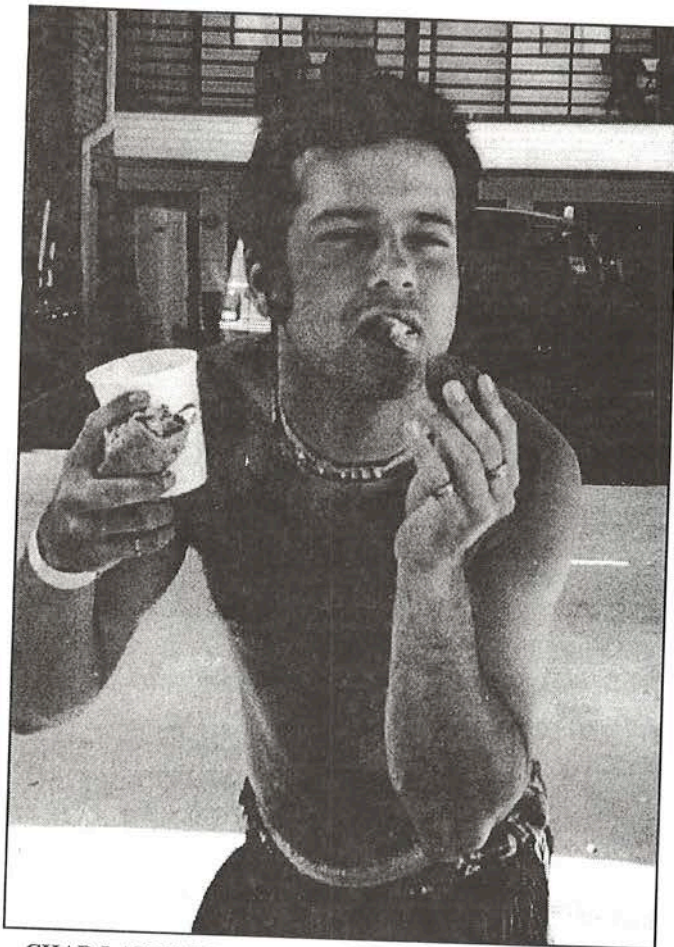
Seniors Defy Death At Dells

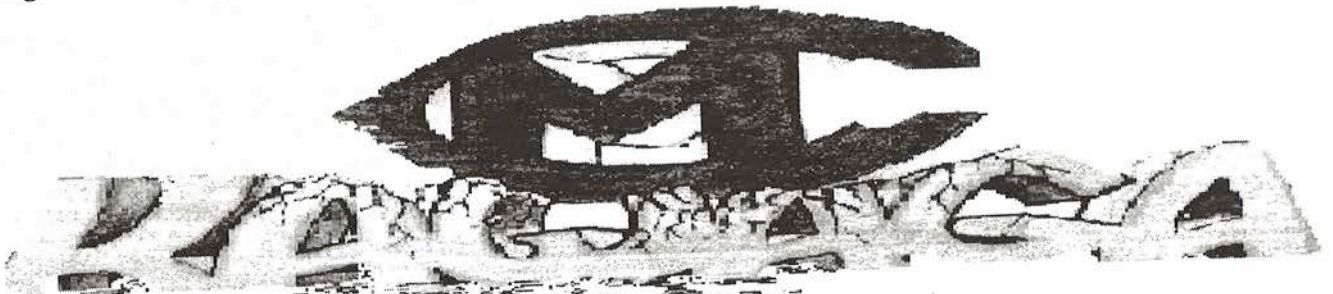

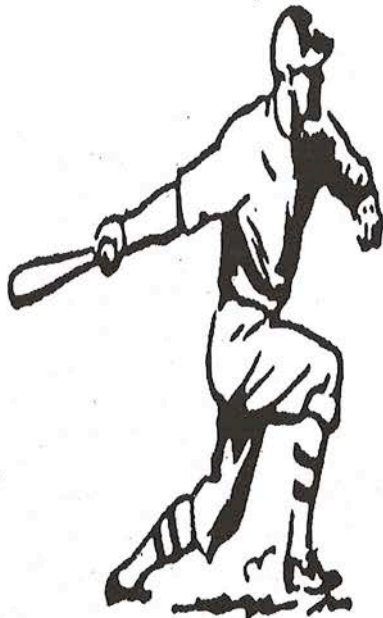
11A Softball Dominates Kawaga

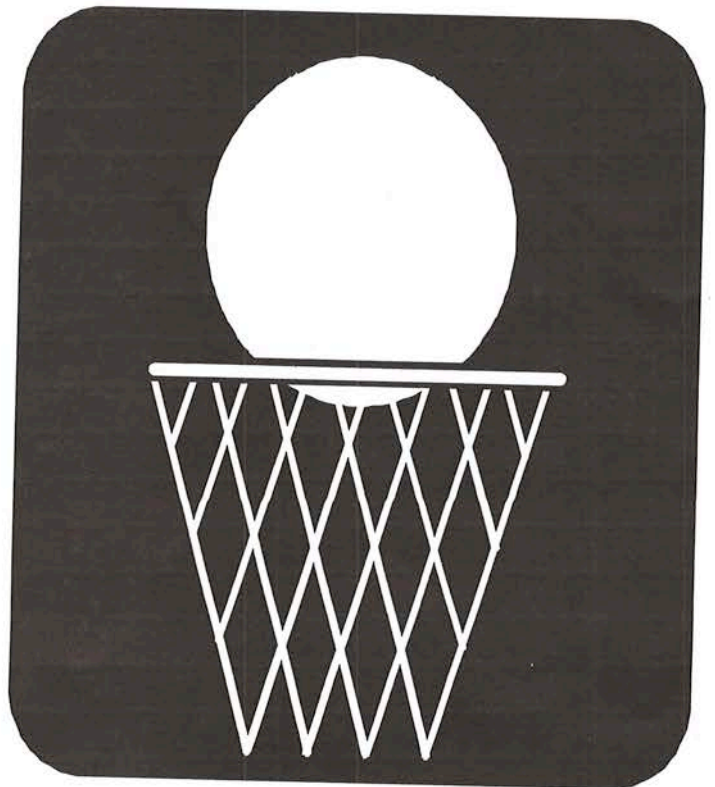

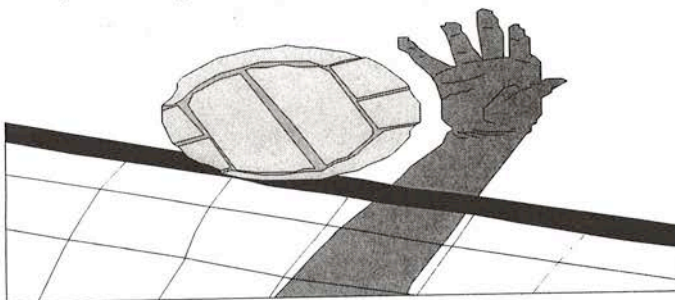

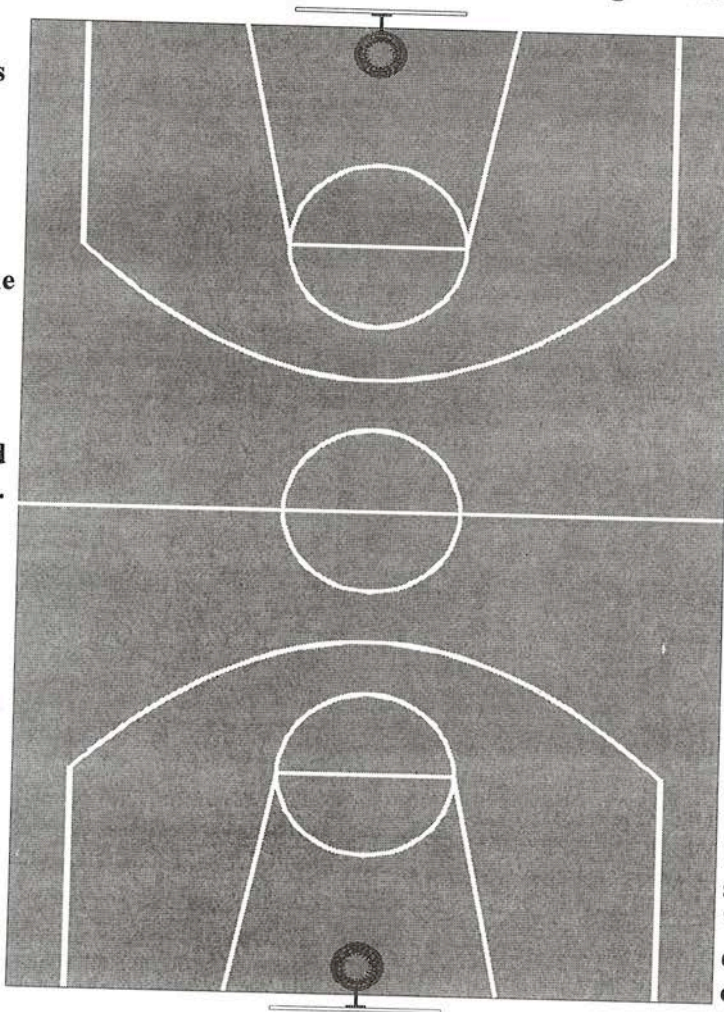
The game was very much of a sea-saw baffle as the teams came into half time with Kawaga ahead by four - 19-15.

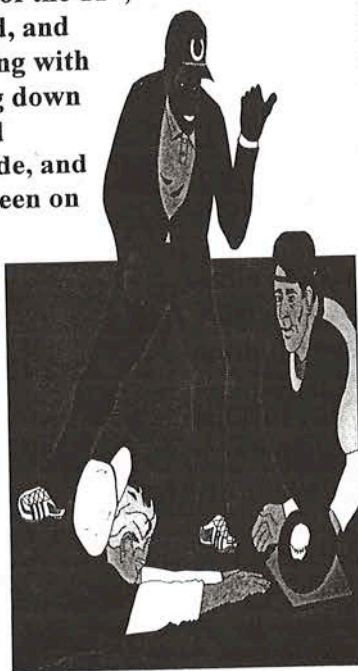

11 & Under C Hoops Victorious By A Trés

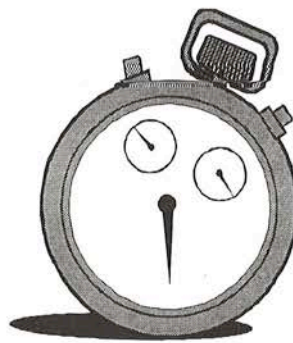

With time winding down, we maintained our well-deserved lead and finished very strongly. A miraculous effort by 11C, coming up victorious in a 19-16 escape of teamwork.

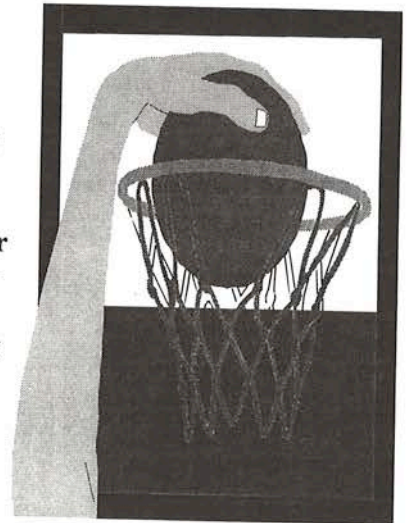


What time is it? Game Time!

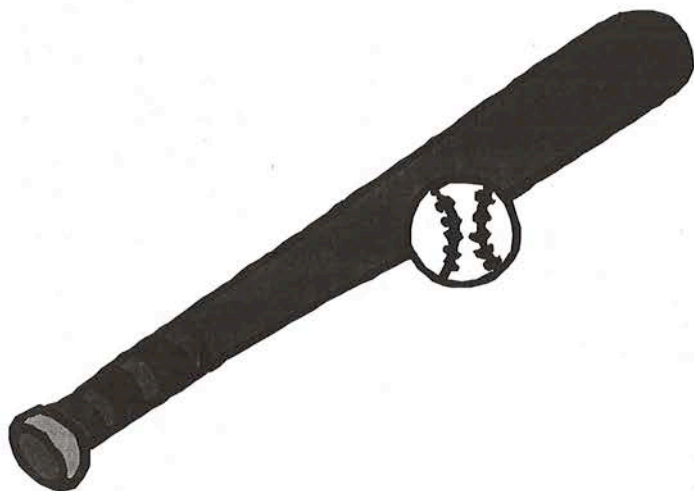


13B Softball Hits Pinacle As A Team

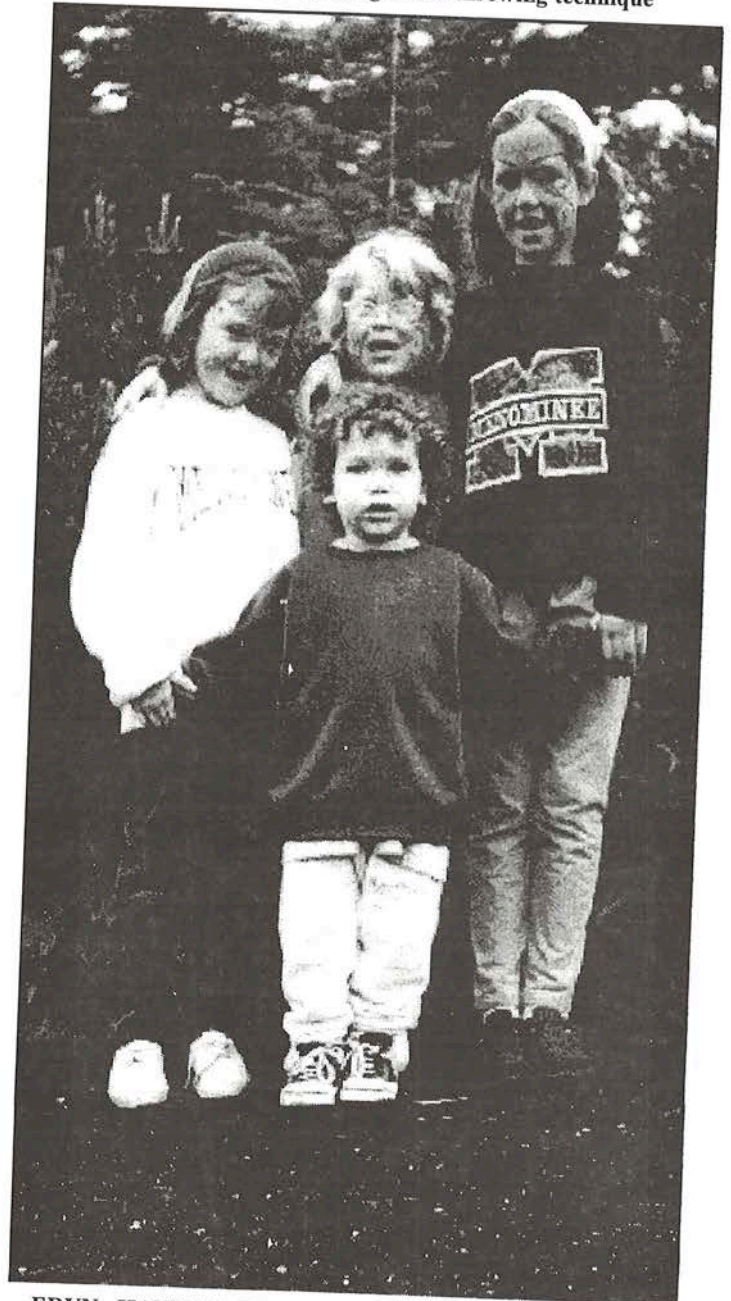

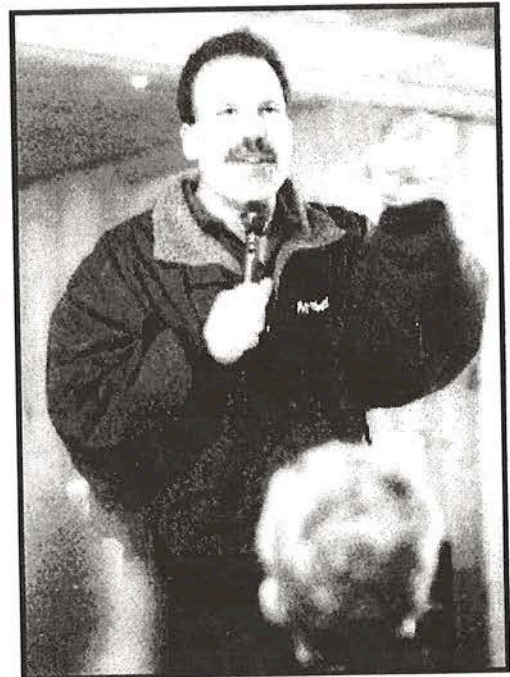
