




The summer is going to be full of fun!

Lastly, we took a look at the voleyball court. There were campers practicing different techniques. After their practice, they played a short game.


Overall, today was a great day for campers and it should only get better.


The Intermediates played a great gaem of football, while the seniors played an exciting new game called "Speedball".




JUNIORS HARDBALL TEAM WIN SEASON OPENER

On a scorching Sunday, 26th of July, Menominee soccer rolled over Kawaga, with four classic goals.


The green and white warriors of Menominee restored pride into a camp that had taken setbacks in softball and basketball.

With the ceremony starting Green and White on Wednesday night, everyone pretty much expected Thursday's picture day extravaganza to end with the first event in 1998 Green and White.



VICTORY TO GREENS IN VROOM!




11B SOCCER FALLS IN SHOOTOUT





TRIBE WIN IT ALL!



As we came to the fire, we sang songs and cheers for one last time. Then,


