
Archery:

stole the 100yd shot competition from the "old timers" who mistook the



The final outcome of the competition will be determined later in the week, but whoever the winner, a good time will definitely have been had by all. Story by David Schwartz





Notes From the Coach



We didn't make a lot of shots. The 2-3 zone defense for Menominee couldn't hold the strong Kawaga scoring elite.





Fisher Finishes First!

1999 Menominee Masters

With the dark clouds rolling in and the rain creeping up from behind, JASON FISHER made a move of his own to steal the Masters from defending champion ROSS GREENSPAN. Greenspan played steadily early, amidst the erratic play of fellow competitors Fisher and MIKE BULGATZ. Bulgatz fell off the lead early and couldn't get back. "I don't know what happened, maybe it was the pressure", he said in his press conference.

Fisher also faltered early with a double and triple bogey on holes 2 and 3, but stayed close. His length was unmatched, routinely driving 20 yards past the others but he threw away too many shots on the slick putting surface. Greenspan seemed to be headed for his second Masters victory coming into 16 with a two shot lead, until Fisher hit his third shot after his second found the beach. "It was the greatest shot in Master's Tournament history!", said tournament director SKIP NELSON, "it may be better than Watson's infamous shot at Pebble Beach." The shot, was a 20 yd bunker shot that bounced three times and charged like a bull straight into the cup for a birdie three, and with Greenspan's bogey, the two shot deficit was gone! "I never hit a shot that great in my life, it was lucky", said Fisher when questioned about what he was thinking as he stood in the bunker.

As they made their way to the 17th tee tied for the championship you could cut the tension with a knife. Fisher took a deep breath and smoked a drive down the right center of the fairway. Greenspan took no time at all and hooked it into the left trees near the out-of-bounds stakes. Unable to tell whether it rested in play or not, Greenspan hit his provisional and walked anxiously toward his ball. Amazingly it stayed a mere five feet in play, where he then breathed a sigh of relief. Both players made their way up to the hole and with a missed putt by Greenspan, Fisher took a one-stroke lead. On the par 3 18th, Fisher hit his 6-iron tee shot 12 feet past the hole and stepped back to watch his challenger. Greenspan misclubbed and came up a little short. His second shot was phenomenal and stopped 6 feet from the cup.

As Fisher lagged up, hoping to get it close for a tap in, he misjudged the soggy conditions and it stopped approximately 4 1/2 feet away from par and the Championship. Greenspan drilled home his par putt and put the pressure on the shoulders of the rookie. As the crowd nervously awaited Fisher's putt, he backed away twice to recheck his line, then finally settled in for *the* putt of his young life. "You could see his knees shake from here", said a spectator from the huge gallery. But shaking or not, Fisher proved his mettle, he sunk the putt, looked up and smiled and the tournament was history! During the post round press conference, Fisher acknowledged his family and his love of the game for helping him persevere. "I love this game", he said as he left the podium. Tournament Director Skip Nelson then spoke of the great fan support and the many sponsors that made it all possible. "the weather was tough, but the fans till found time to come out and cheer on these great competitors. We'd like to thank them and the sponsors like Gene's Canteen H2O, for their continued support, and hope to be back next year". 
