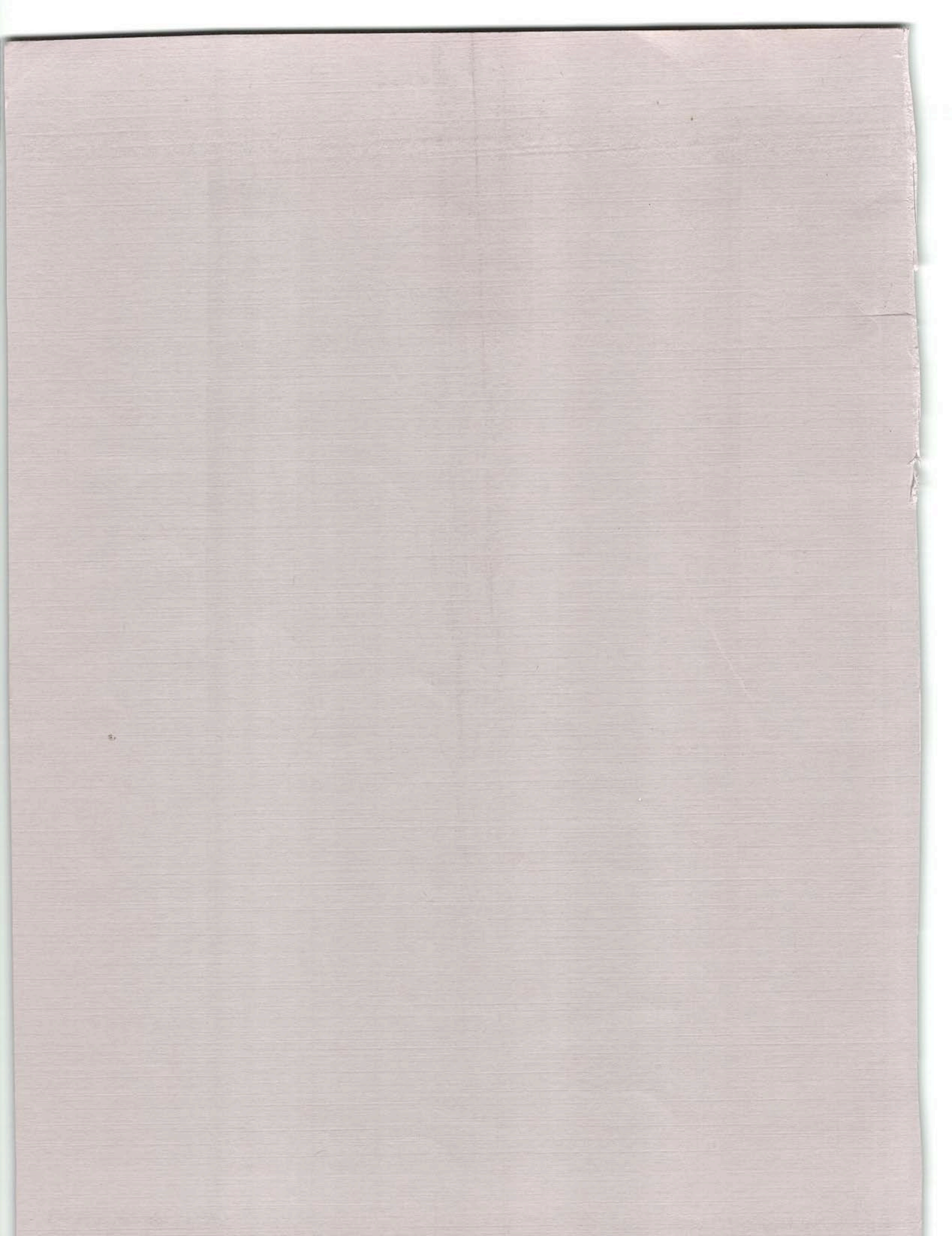

Welcome to Camp Menominee. This is the first season of camp in the new millennium. Let's set the standard this summer for the next 1000 years!

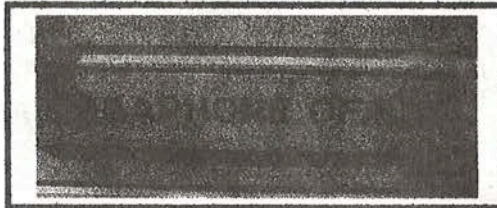

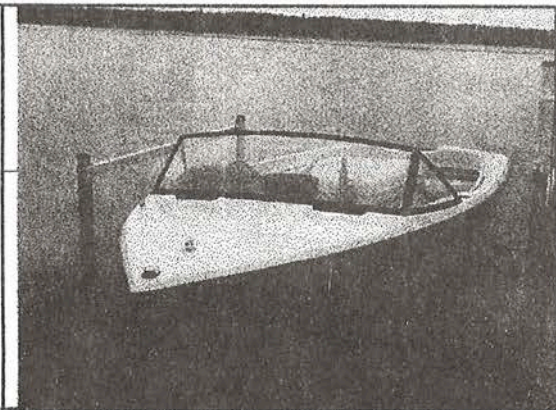

Well, with all this new stuff how could it get any better...?

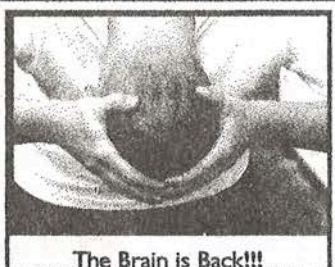

Rainbow Falls Makes a Splash

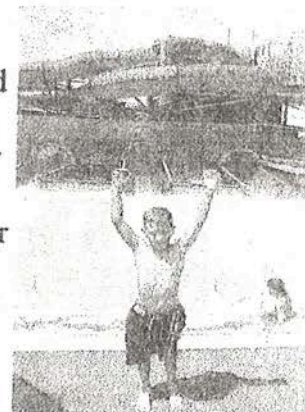

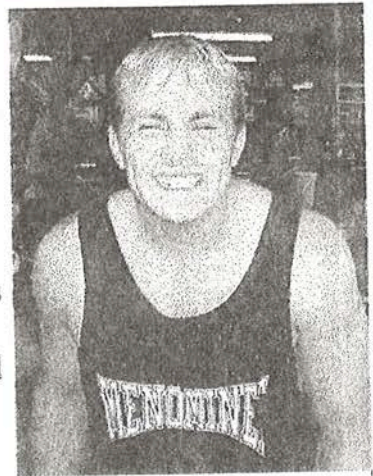

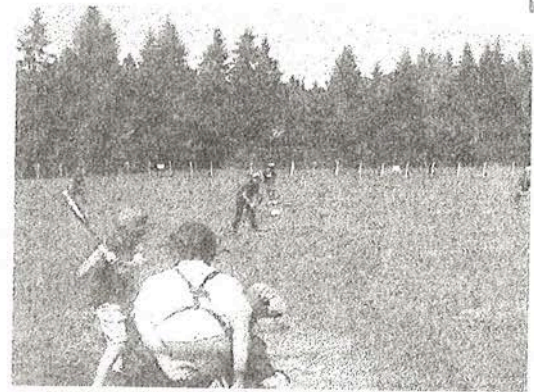
In the first inter-camp competition of the 2000 summer, the Menominee 16 and Under baseball team won a close game with our opponents from Camp Timberlane.

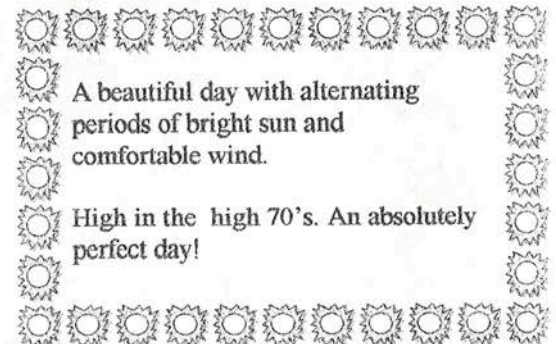

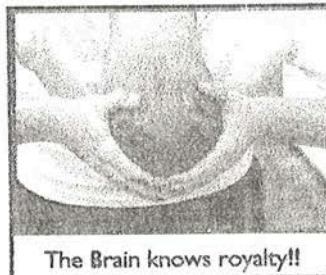

Captain's Duel it Out

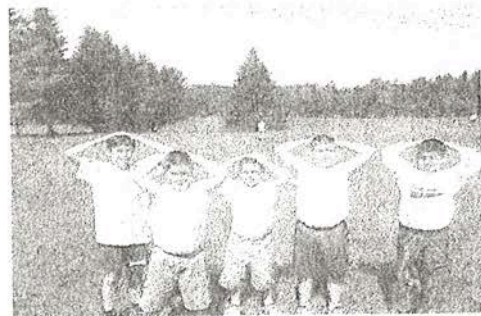

The final Luigi player to remain on the court was JOSH WEINSTEIN who played very well and knocked out his share of Mario players.

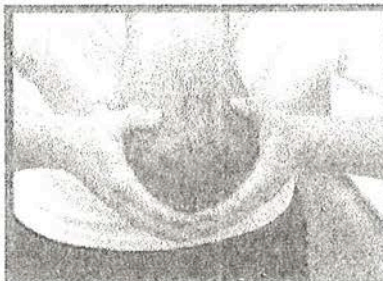

Before sending the Menominee boys into competition, NATE WASSERMAN used to remind our campers, “Win or lose, the sun will rise tomorrow.” Well, of course, AL WASS took his father’s words to heart and use to impart the same wisdom to all CM before the traditional big event against Kawaga. In fact, in STEVE’s first year as a camper, he can remember Alan’s advice and also the spirit generated by the big day against Kawaga.

“The competition was something everyone in camp looked forward to because it was so much fun and brought everybody together for a common purpose,” says Steve.

In fact, by the early ‘90s, under GLENN and DAWN KLEIN, the competition swelled to include 54 events in Softball, Basketball, Volleyball, Hockey, Tennis, Track, Archery, Riflery, and Swimming. Many of the team sports went five teams deep in each age group to accommodate as many boys as possible. This, of course, was perfectly in line with Menominee’s philosophy of getting the maximum number of boys involved in as many games and different experiences as possible.

“An important part of ‘The Menominee Way’ has always been, and will always be, to see as much participation in as many things as we can,” commented Steve.

However, over time Kawaga, under new directorship, began backing away from the 50 plus year inter-camp tradition between the two camps. Knowing how good an experience rallying all Menominee’s guys together for the annual effort was, Steve continued to work to see the competition continue--even to the point of agreeing to Kawaga’s request to cut the number of events and sports in half over the last couple of years.

This year, though, Kawaga decided they would only agree to have the fifteen and sixteen year olds and counselors compete. This so violated Menominee’s whole approach of seeing full participation that Steve felt to go forward with it was not possible and would send the wrong message to our kids.

“Camp, especially big summer moments like Kawaga, Green and White, Twi-Light League, etc. are for all our campers. We wouldn’t have Color War for just a handful of our guys because traditionally everyone participates and so many would be disappointed if they didn’t have a chance. Kawaga’s been such an important relationship and experience for our camp that I couldn’t just see a small group getting to participate when there is no reason not to at least continue what we’ve had recently with them. We really treasure what we’ve had with Kawaga and hope to rekindle the tradition in the future,” Steve said.

We won’t gloss over the fact that not competing with Kawaga this year is a disappointment. However, “when you get lemons, make lemonade.” We’ve created so many new and exciting events for CM 2000 that we believe our boys are still very much having the summer of their lives. And regardless of whether we win or lose, or what “curve ball” might be thrown at us, our attitude demonstrates Nate Wass’ words and “The Menominee Way”: At CM “the sun will rise tomorrow”.

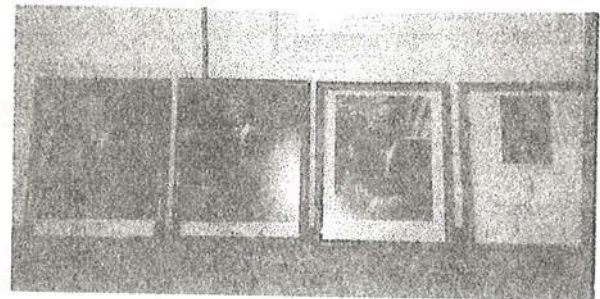
