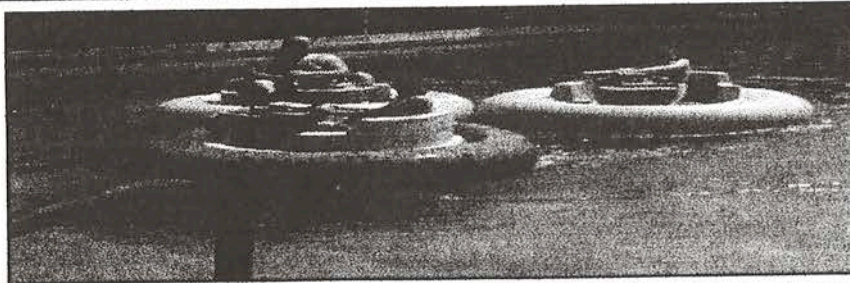
CAMP MENOMINEE LOVES FISHING BY ALEX JACOBS

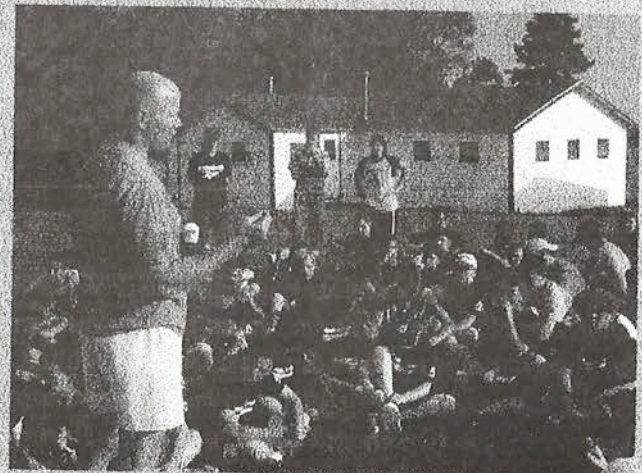
SUN AND WIND REPORT

Cabin 3 & 4 Trip to Copper Falls

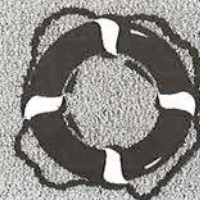

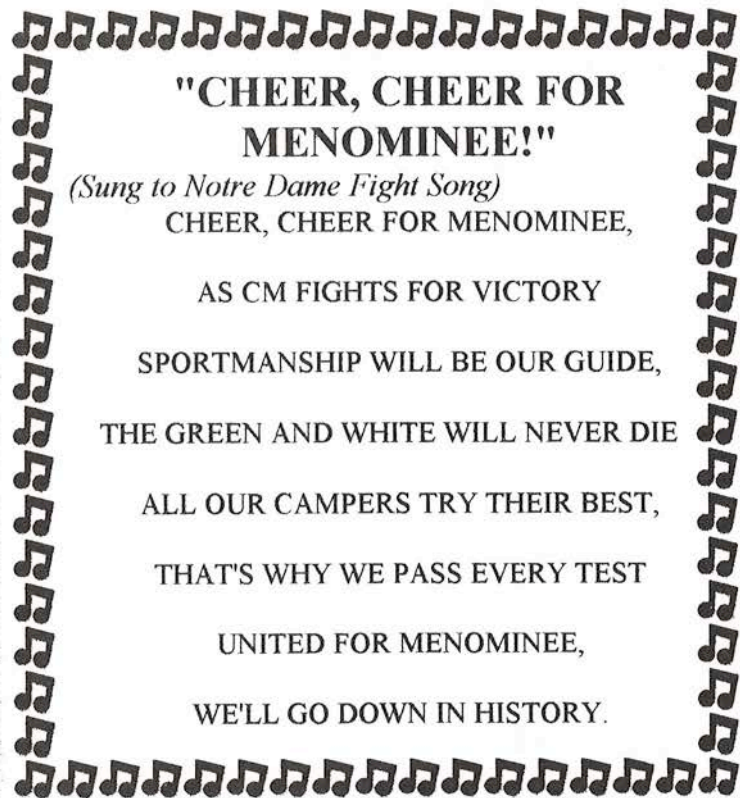
EGG DROP 2001
