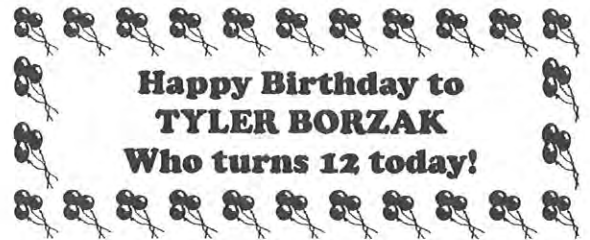
Senior Cabin Hit the Town!
