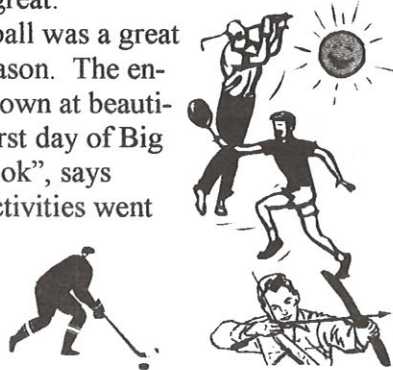

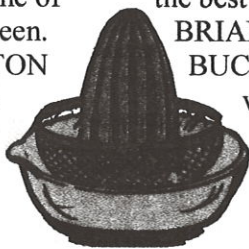
## Detroit Forces Game 7

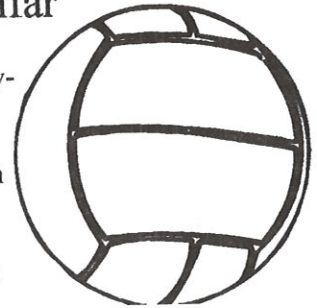


## 16 A Volleyball vs. Ojibwa

## 11B Football Plays Hard Till the Final Whistle

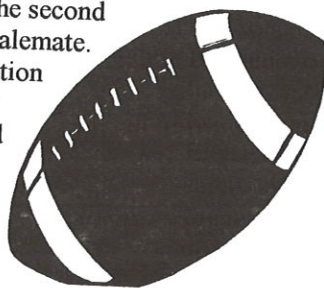

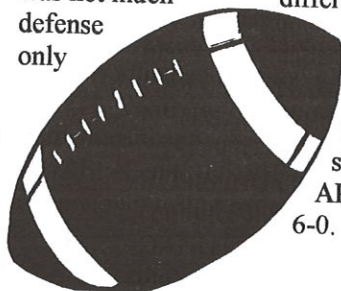
## 11C Football Loses a Tough Game

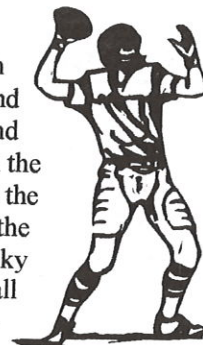

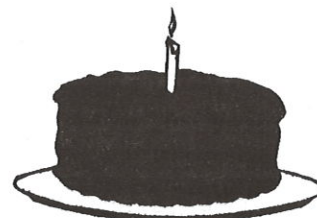
## New Trier Gets By HP in Jr. MFL Championship

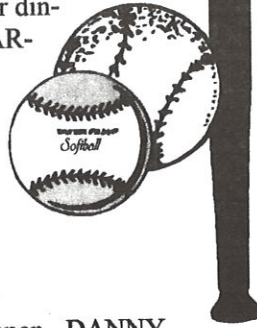

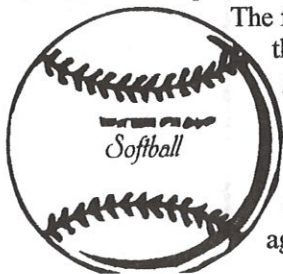
## Chaimovitz Bests Berns in Extra Inning

## Counselor Sweep Completed as Menominee Defeats Kawaga one last time

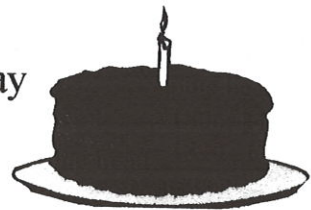

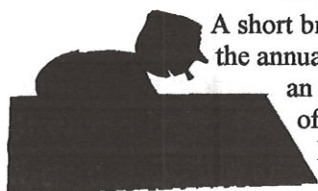
## Greens Win Relay, Whites win Competition
