
Dear Megaphone Readers,





Thank You for Your Hard Work





Sesterday, all the new campers arrived for this great summer. They were greeted by over forty of their cheering counselors as they went from the buses to Wasserman Hall where they had an exciting Pep Rally and received their cabin assignments. After unpacking with their new friends, they went to dinner and ate in the Menominee Mess Hall, which WOODY loudly declared was "The Best Place to Eat in the North Woods!" We all had our fill of Lasagna and then went back to Wasserman Hall to pick up an uncooked egg. This was not desert but the first Campfire, or Evening Activity, of the year. The point of the Egg Drop Challenge is to successfully drop an egg off the top of Menominee's fifty foot high Climbing Tower without having it break. The rules are that the egg must to be protected using only all-

natural materials gathered in the woods here around camp. Everyone started off with a cylindrical piece of birch wood, but what the cabins did from there varied greatly.

Two cabins won, and the first surprised us all. We watched in disbelief as Cabin 5's huge looking log structure was lifted to the top of the tower and dropped the long way down. It hit the earth with the loudest thud of all the egg modules that were built, but unlike the others the egg inside of this contraption survived, even though there was a huge rock inside. IVAN RODRIGUEZ, one of Cabin 5's counselors, told us the secret. The idea was largely attributed to CODY FLANZER who said a huge piece of hollow birch wood would work best if one side was weighed down with a rock so that it fell vertically. When it impacted, the egg gently fell through the hollow cylinder, landing softly on the cushioned rock. Good engineering, Guys!

The second cabin to win was Cabin 15. They employed a similar method, but used a smaller design cushioned with a bottom of soft ferns. Even though they had doubts as to whether dropping rocks with eggs would work, GRANT GORDON and JACKSON HARRIS were very helpful in getting everything they needed to build their successful module.


MCAA Football By Adam Sovanski

This was the first game of the season for both teams. After the game, SCWARTZ said, "We played swell, and did great!"






Skits for Commercial Night By Neil Heckman




smooth reverse layup. SCOTT SHARFMAN also had a powerful drive into the key after shaking off and running right by the Ojibwa defense.


Bingo & Texas Hold'em Night By Michael Malis

Lee Libby Leads Menominee to Win in Tennis By Neil Heckman





Copper Falls Trip By Gordon Spowage




GOODMAN took the victory for the Americans.



13 Over Basketball Victory Against Timberlane By Brian Bulgatz



Gearing Up to Kick Butt




