



Congratulations to LEVI PASIKOV who received his trophy today at lunch from KOZ for getting on up two feet at water skiing! Way to go LEVI!






CABIN 12 TRIP

A TRIP TO REMEMBER BY SAM LAZAR





things about the 4th of July are MARIMETA, MARIMETA and MARIMETA.







In short, we've had a great time so far. The first session is ending with two Twilight League Championships, a pizza party, the waterfront and even more sunshine.







TWILIGHT LEAGUE STARTED WITH A SHOCK BY DANIEL MALIS

MAX BEERMAN almost jumped out of his shoes because he was so happy!



This week's Way was hosted by none other than the first year American counselors. After witnessing a splendid fire the previous week, the Americans were determined to go one better.






