

League were announced.



The bad weather that had caused the competition to be postponed from Monday stayed away and the sun shone all day.


Menominee started at a disadvantage as cabin 12 was away on a raft trip, so most of our seniors were not here. Even so everyone tried their best, and although we lost overall,

In the morning we had breakfast and then we bathed in the creek. For lunch we stopped at an A&W. On the way back we stopped by Bond falls.



Day three started with the All Camp Running Relay. There were 63 legs and so some people ran twice. The lead changed hands several times and the final result was never certain until the very end.




Next Andy Becker played John Schwartz in the intermediates, Beckers height advantage was enough to secure a victory for the cabin ten camper.





Menominee has had an immeasurable impact on their lives, and they have done their part to make our camp the special place it is. We're proud of all of them.


