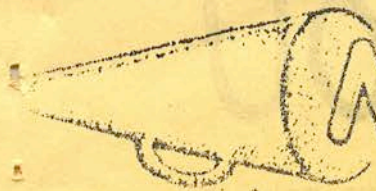

Last night was sports night. Every cabin made up their own sport that may be played in the future.

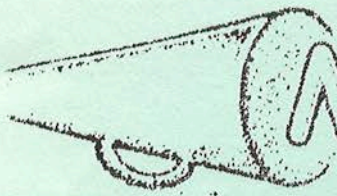

The bad weather that had caused the competition to be postponed from Monday stayed away and the sun shone all day.

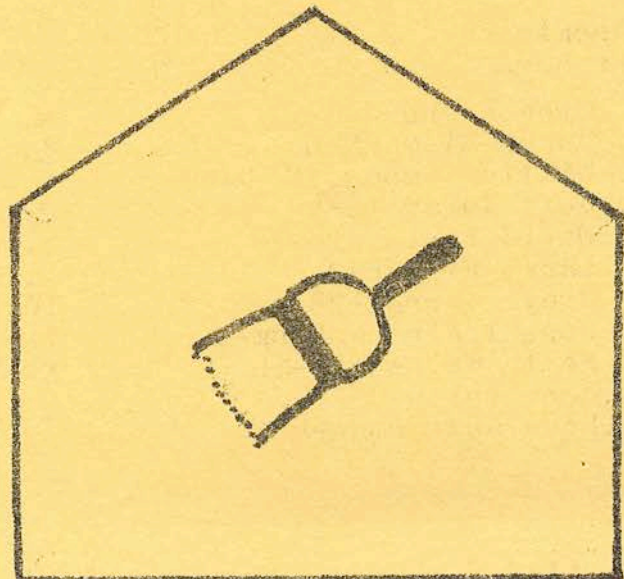
Menominee started at a disadvantage as cabin 12 was away on a raft trip, so most of our seniors were not here. Even so everyone tried their best, and although we lost overall,

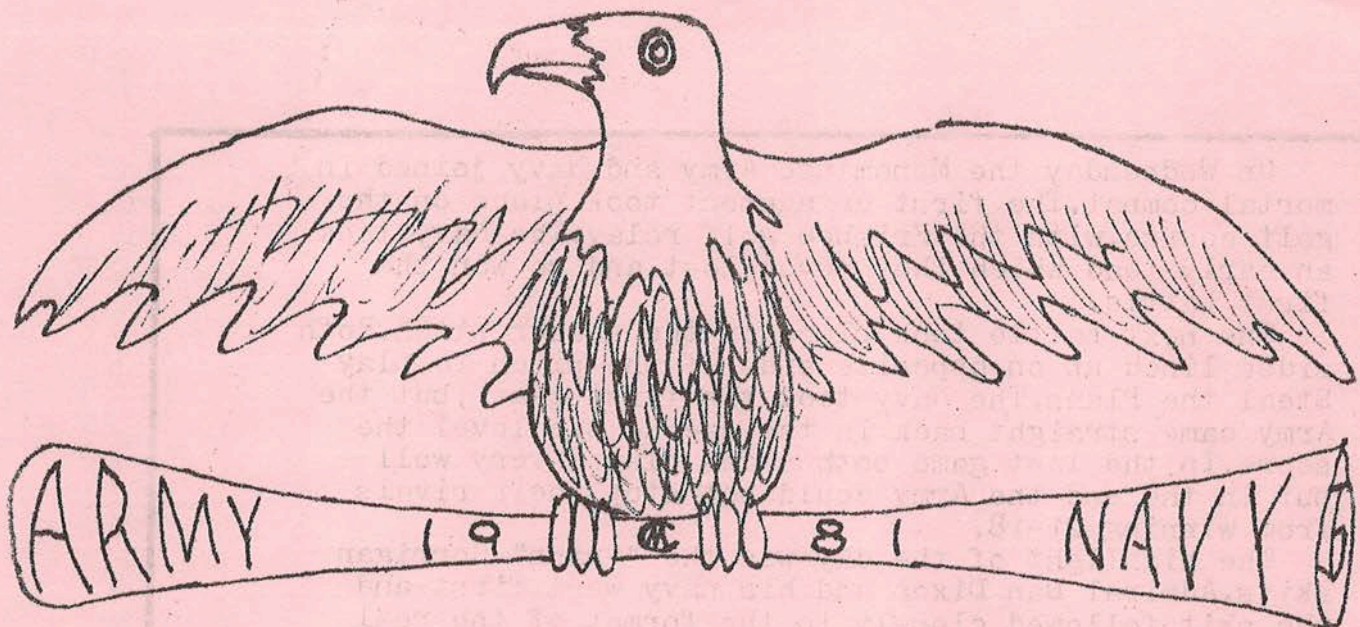
Day three started with the All Camp Running Relay. There were 6 legs and so some people ran twice. The lead changed hands several times and the final result was never certain until the very end.

The highlight of the evening was Leon Parks singing the National Anthem in his own inimitable way.

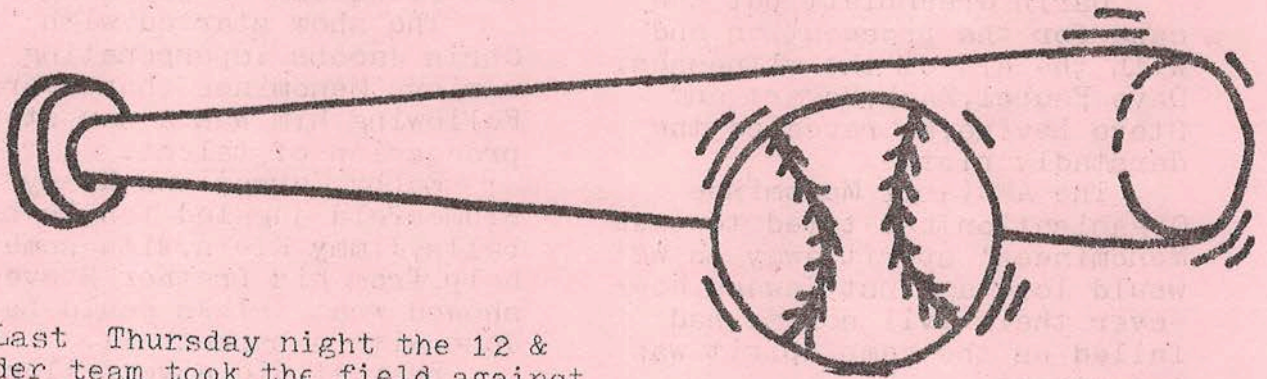
All participants got and deserved pizza after the show.

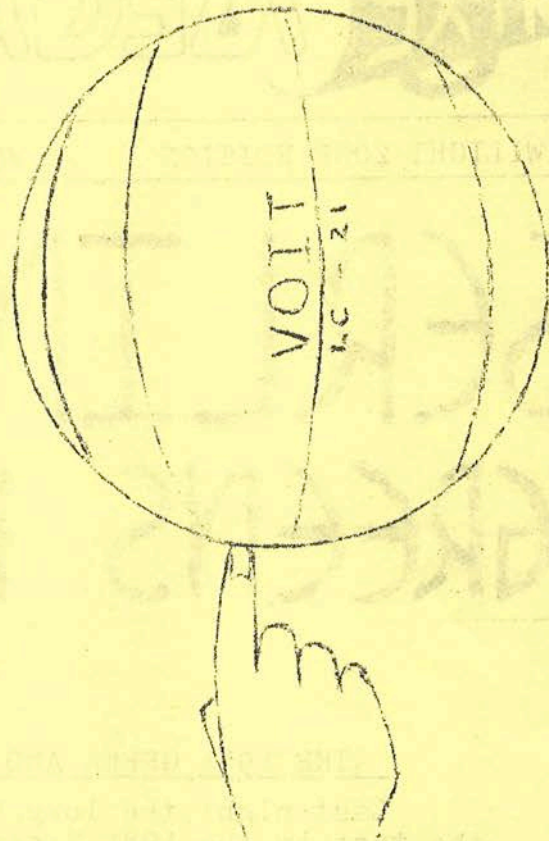
Next Andy Becker played John Schwartz in the intermediates, Beckers height advantage was enough to secure a victory for the cabin ten camper.
