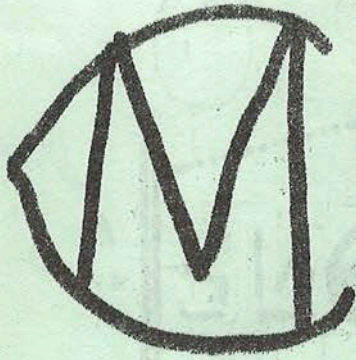


## MENOMINEE PREVAILS ONCE AGAIN!!!!

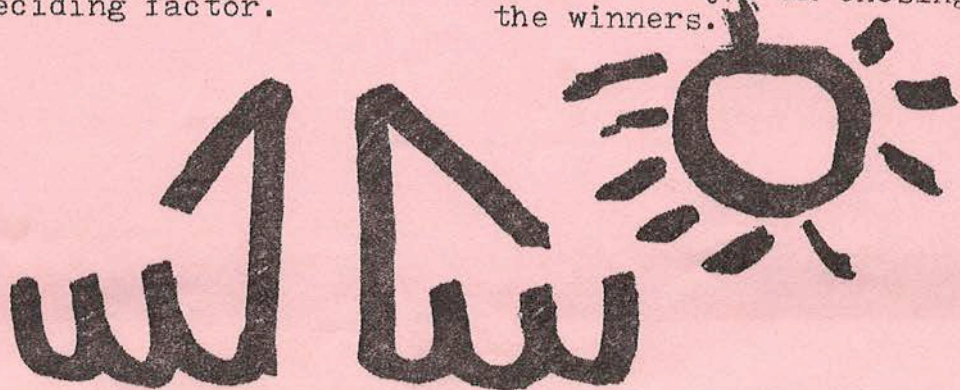

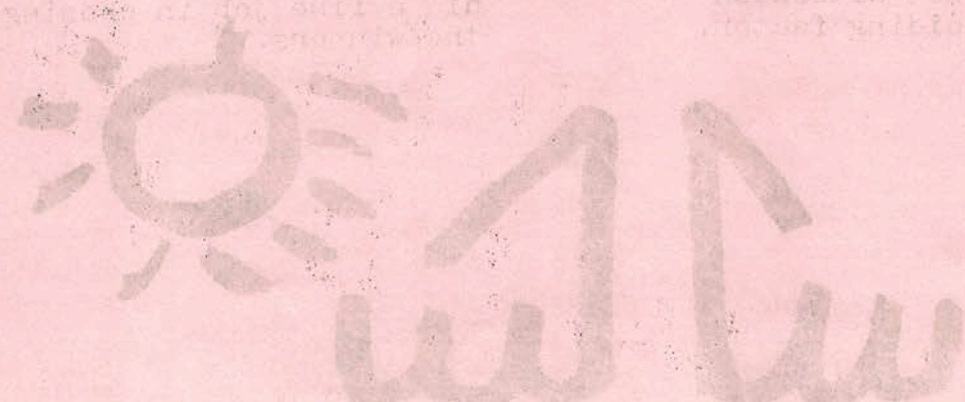

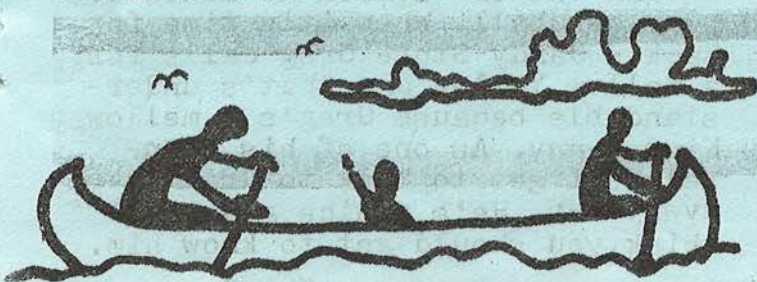
### THE CANOE TRIP

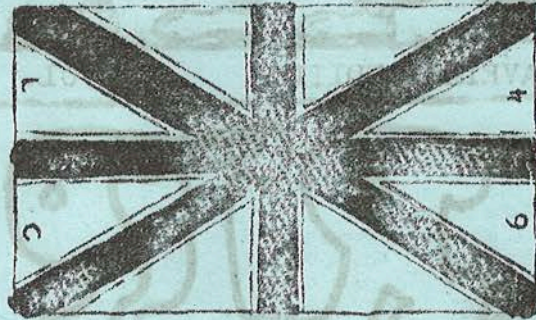

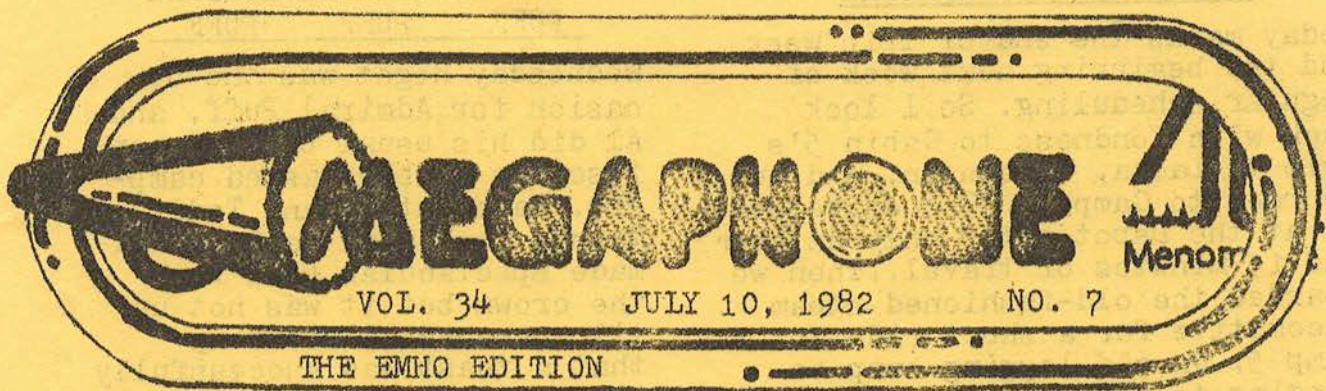

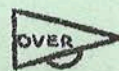
# A MID SUMMER'S
