CAMP MENOMINEE WELCOMES YOU!

Tonight, Camp Menominee is on the verge of its 57th season, which will begin when our boys arrive on Sunday. We are very proud of our camp, facilities and staff, so tonight we most wholeheartedly welcome you, our neighbors, to Camp Menominee!

At CM, even though we offer opportunities for many team sports, such as softball and soccer, and individual sports such as tennis, we are not oriented purely toward athletics. Campers are also given the chance to take part in such activities as the camp newspaper, The Daily Megaphone; drama and arts and crafts. Not to mention Monopoly games!

We also put great emphasis on the growth of a camper as an individual. The philosophy of CM is stated very simply by the phrase "make the effort." Though everyone would like to win every time, we teach the kids that this is not possible. In fact, we help them realize that in life a well-timed defeat can be much more beneficial than a hollow victory. Giving it your best shot and being a good sport are values we try to instill in all of our young men.

This year we have 105 boys, 101 campers and 4 Counselors In Training (CITs), coming here to spend the summer with us. The boys are mainly from the Chicago area, but do come from all over the country. They range in age from 7 to 16 years old. Menominee is a nonsectarian camp. Campers and counselors of all religions, races and backgrounds are welcome and encouraged to attend. Nearly 60 of these campers have already spent at least one summer here. Some who started as campers and are now counselors have spent as many as 12 seasons at CM!

And while they are here, the kids don't simply run around in the woods. Their daily activities are safely and carefully planned and supervised by a dedicated staff of 50 people, including 31 counselors. It is this type of attention to the needs of our campers that has allowed us to become accredited by the American Camping Association.

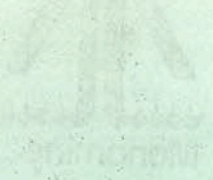
Camp Menominee is owned by Glenn and Dawn Klein. Glenn has spent a part of every year of his life in the North Woods. He first came to CM as a camper at the age of 9 and since then has been a CIT, counselor and director. Glenn met his future wife Dawn at the University of Wisconsin. She started her CM career in 1981 as the camp nurse. She and Glenn were married at camp last year during Colorama.

Glenn and Dawn have made this camp the work of their lives. They love the camp, campers and the North Woods nearly as much as they love each other.

Glenn and Dawn purchased the camp last winter from Alan and Elaine Wasserman. Camp Menominee was founded in 1928 near Rhinelander by Alan's parents, Nate and Edna Wasserman. In 1947, the Wassermans purchased the present 110-acre camp site from Charles Comisky, former owner of the Chicago White Sox.

As a reminder of this, the green and white pillars you see off Hwy. D were originally surrounding Comisky Field in Chicago.

We are all very happy to be at Camp Menominee in this most beautiful part of the world and to be your friends and neighbors. Thank you for being here tonight!

Daniel is from Deerfield, where he will be in 4th Grade at Kipling this fall. He has three brothers and two sisters, and when he's home, likes to work with his computer.

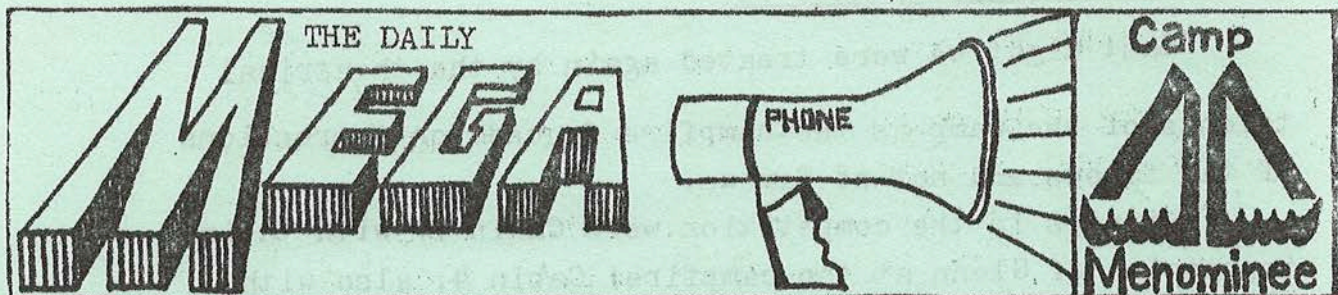

SENIOR HARDBALL HAS UPS AND DOWNS

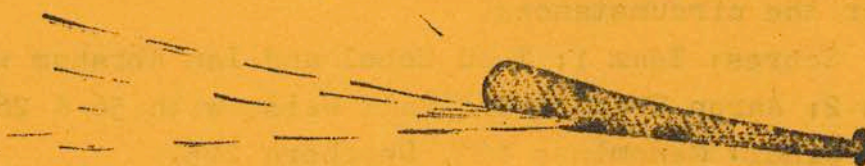

In the words of Steve Kleinberg, a good time was had by all.

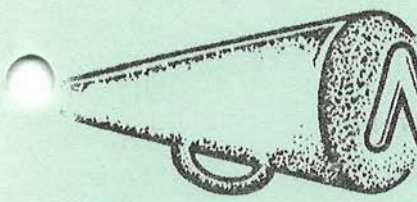

When he's not in camp, Jordan collects stamps from around the world. But only mint sets.

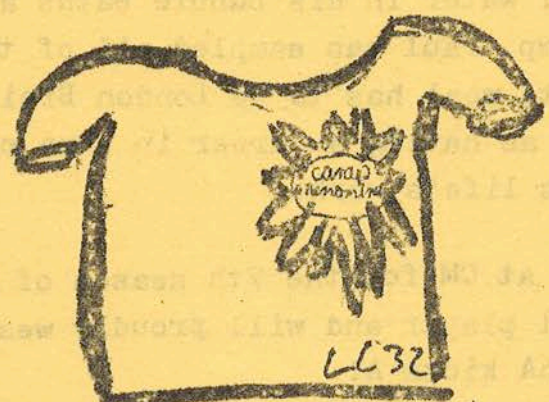

The junior member of the CIT team is Jon Schwartz. He has been at camp for 5 summers, just long enough to realize that his favorite film is "Tom Mixes Cement."

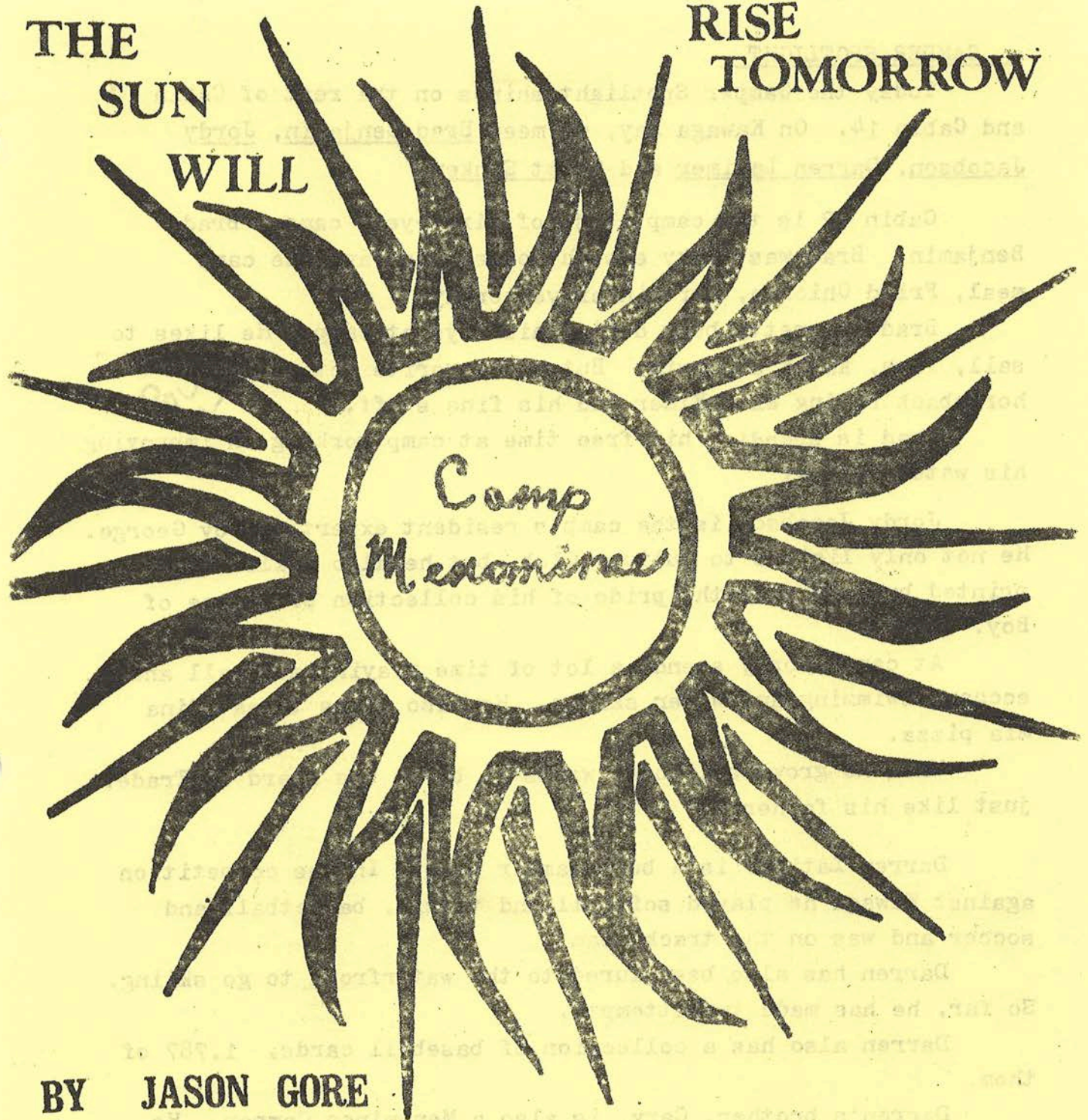



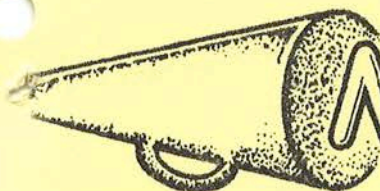
When Gurv goes out into the real world, he wants to own his own restaurant. It will undoubtedly serve Chicken Kiev, his favorite camp food.

The camp pizza is the choice food of this future lawyer.

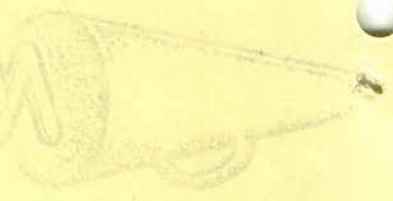

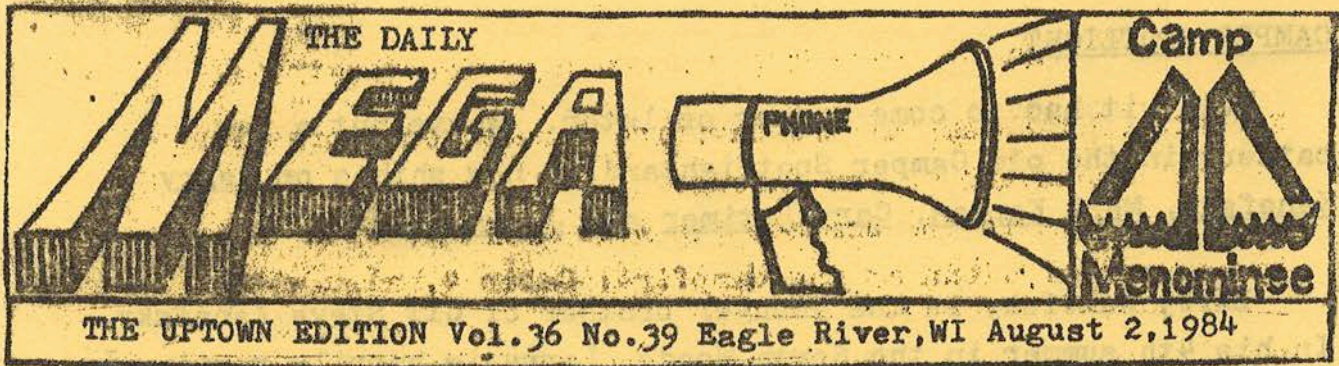

Jason Rose is at CM for his second season. He has spent the last couple of days in the old infirmary, but should be out in time to see this this afternoon.

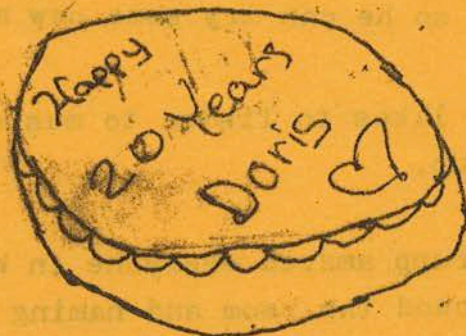

Matt wants to play professional soccer and got a start on that by scoring his first goal in a camp competition this summer against Deerhorn.

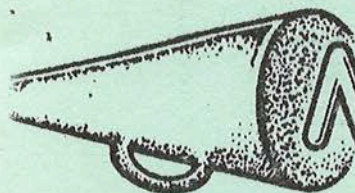
Jeff Morris is the younger brother of Senior Greg Morris.

MATT MILLER, JASON GORE WIN LETTER CONTEST

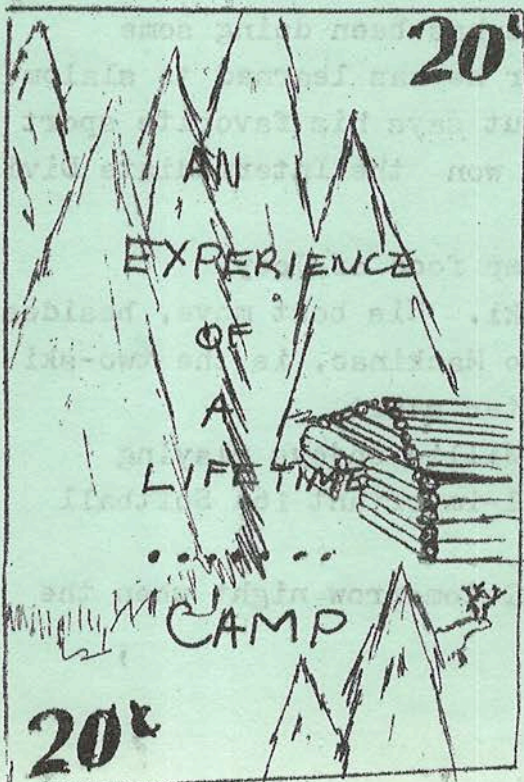
