

Andy has a sister, Robin, who will be at Marimeta this summer.





YEAH, RAH RAH IN THE MESS HALL



DRAMA CLASSES BEGIN





OPENING DAY (NIGHT?) FOR TWI-LIGHT SEASON
























THE MAN IN THE GLASS



All of the coaches were very impressed that a team with only a limited number of practices could combine to do as well as they did. Special thanks to all who helped with the meet.


