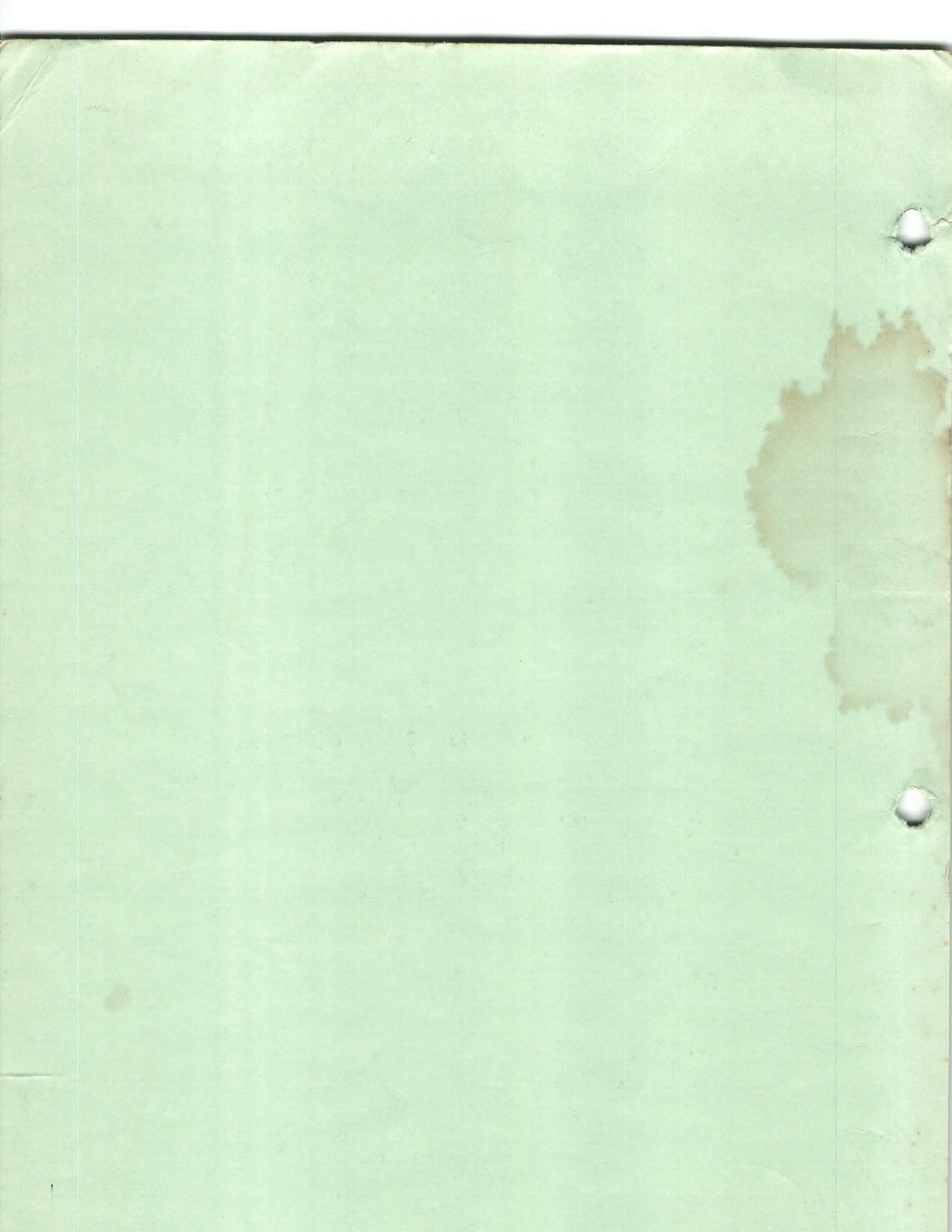

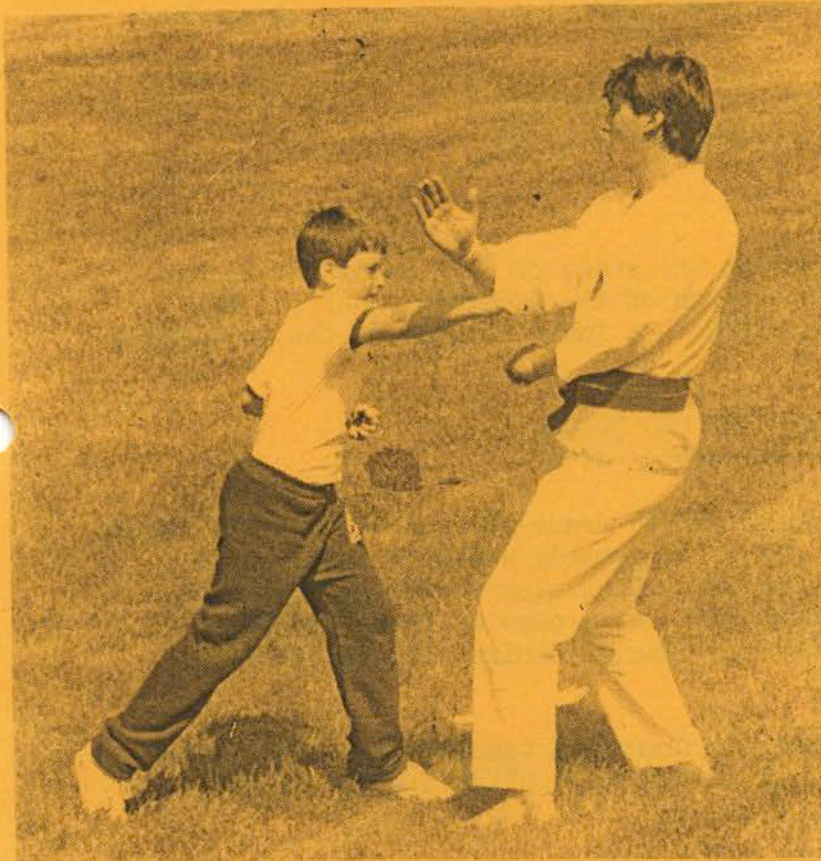
Andy has a sister, Robin, who will be at Marimeta this summer.

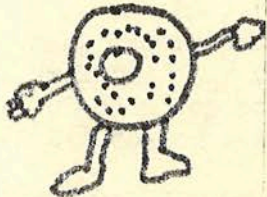

Tennis is BRANDON'S favorite sport, which he'll be spending a lot of time at this summer. Most of his sleeping hours will be spent in Cabin 17.

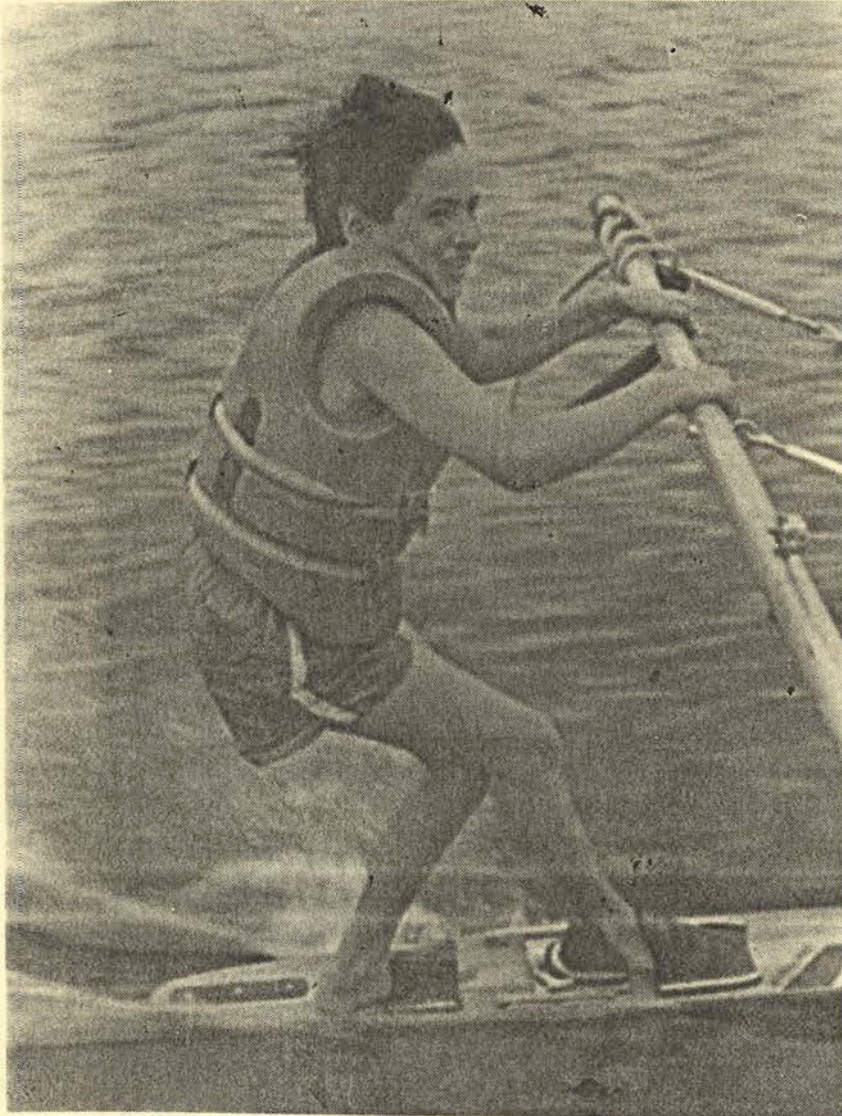

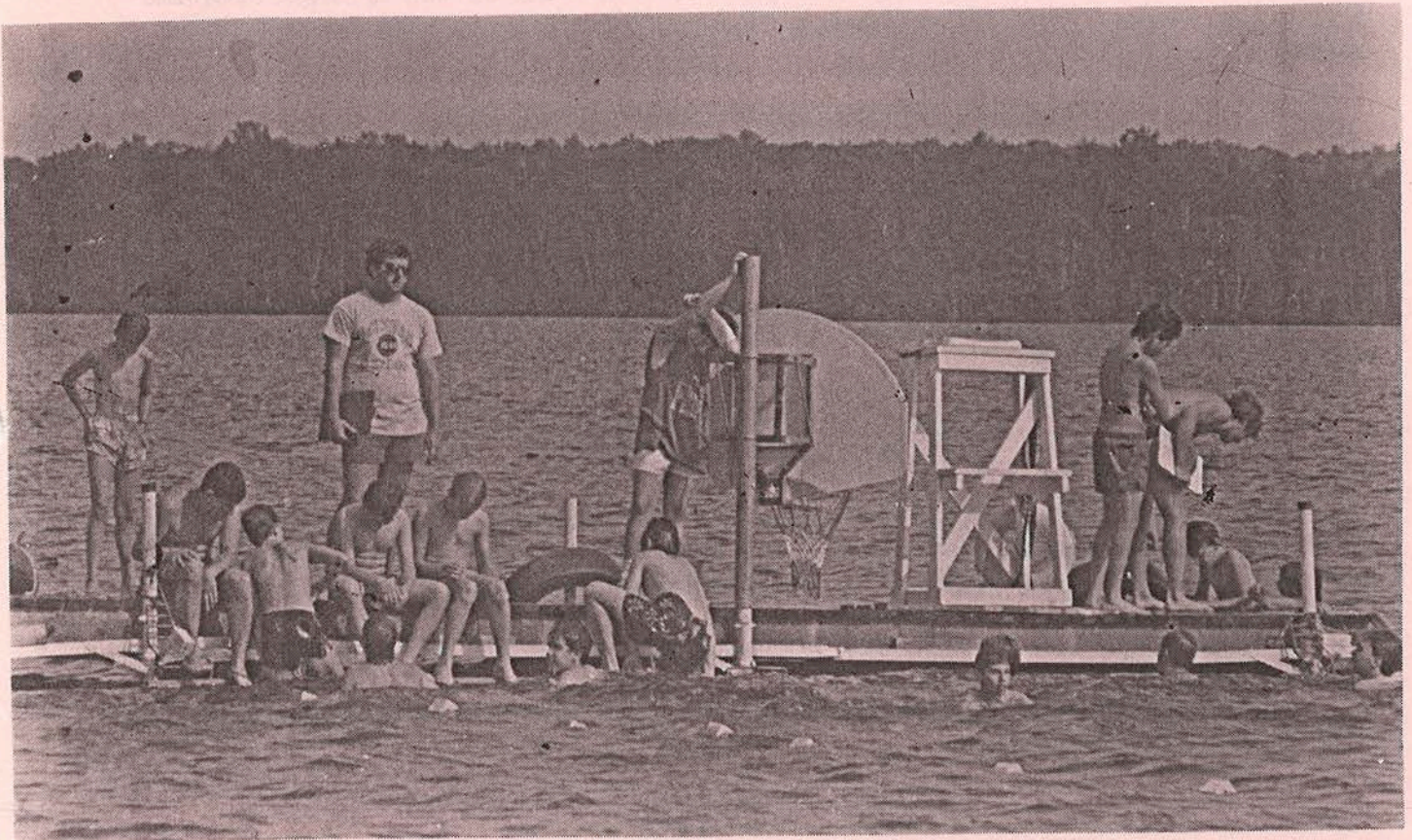

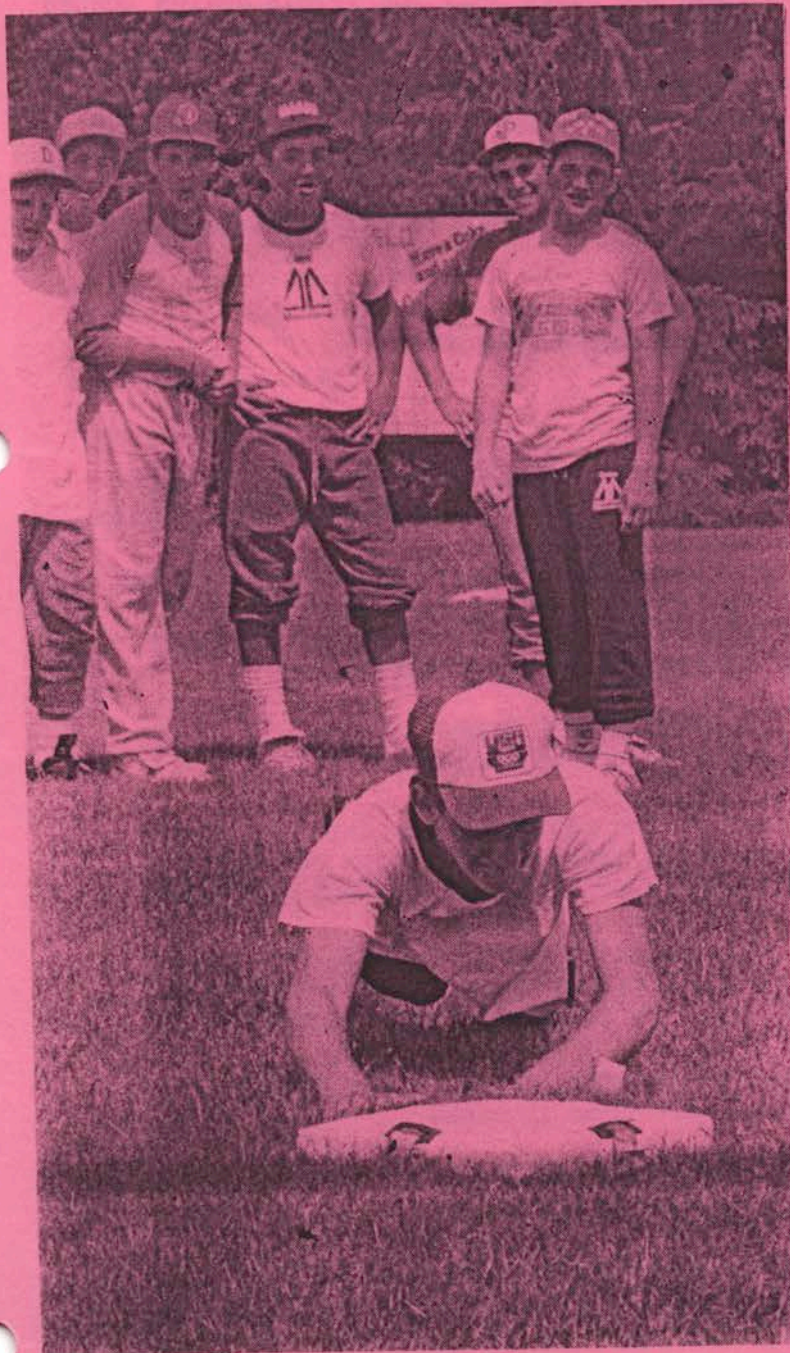

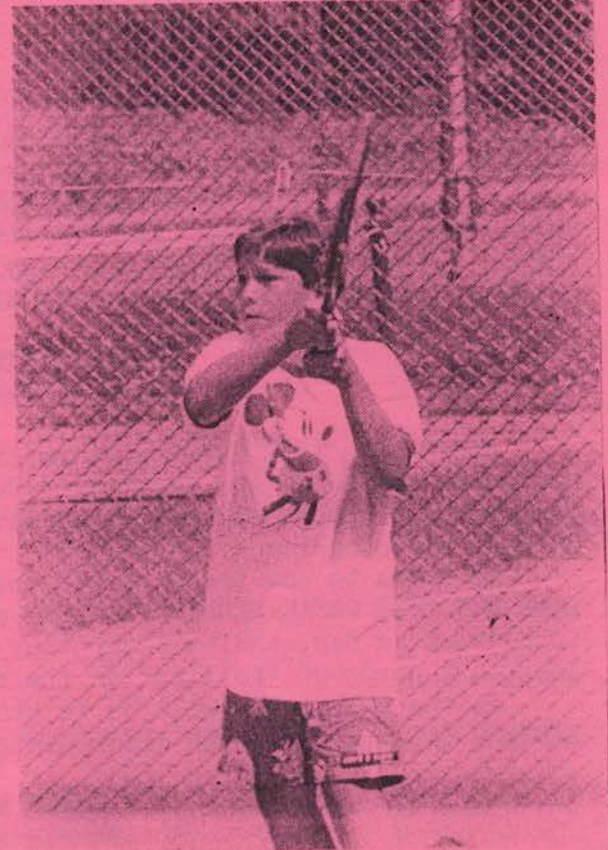

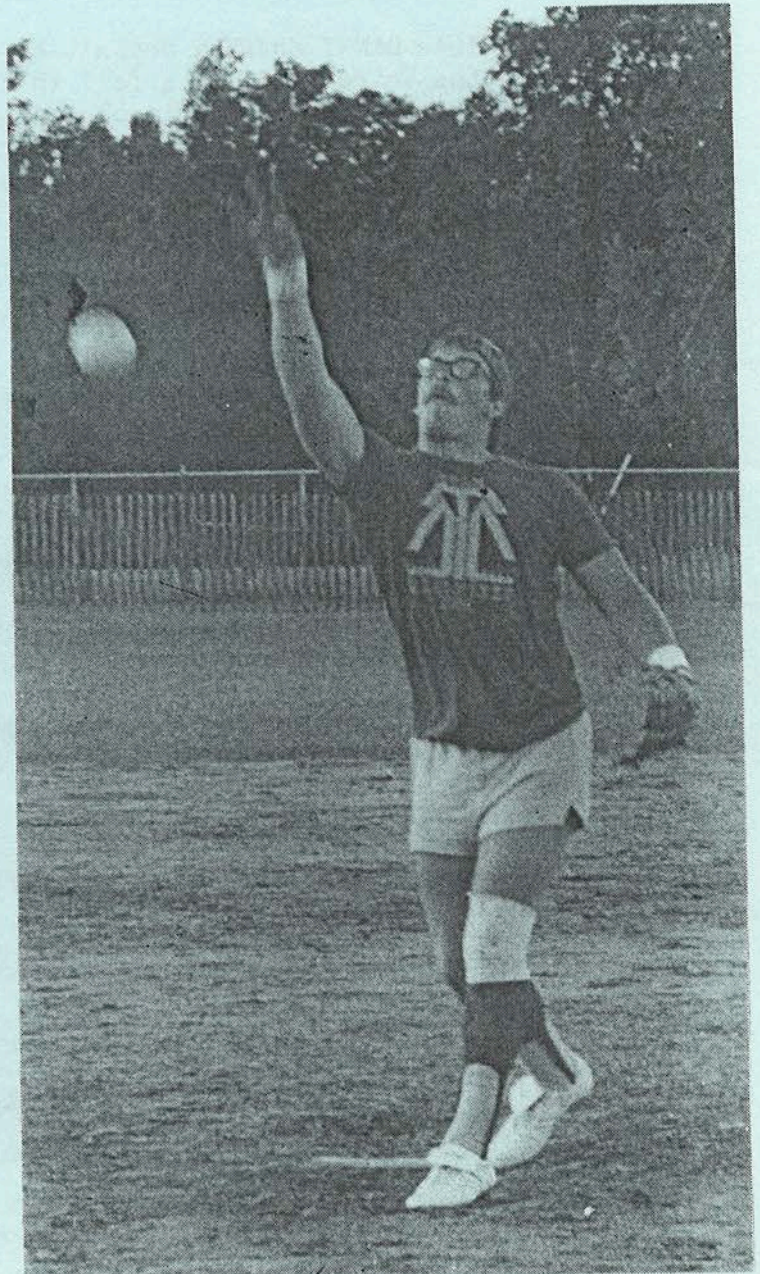

Without a doubt, the team was helped by the enormous spirit of Menominee!

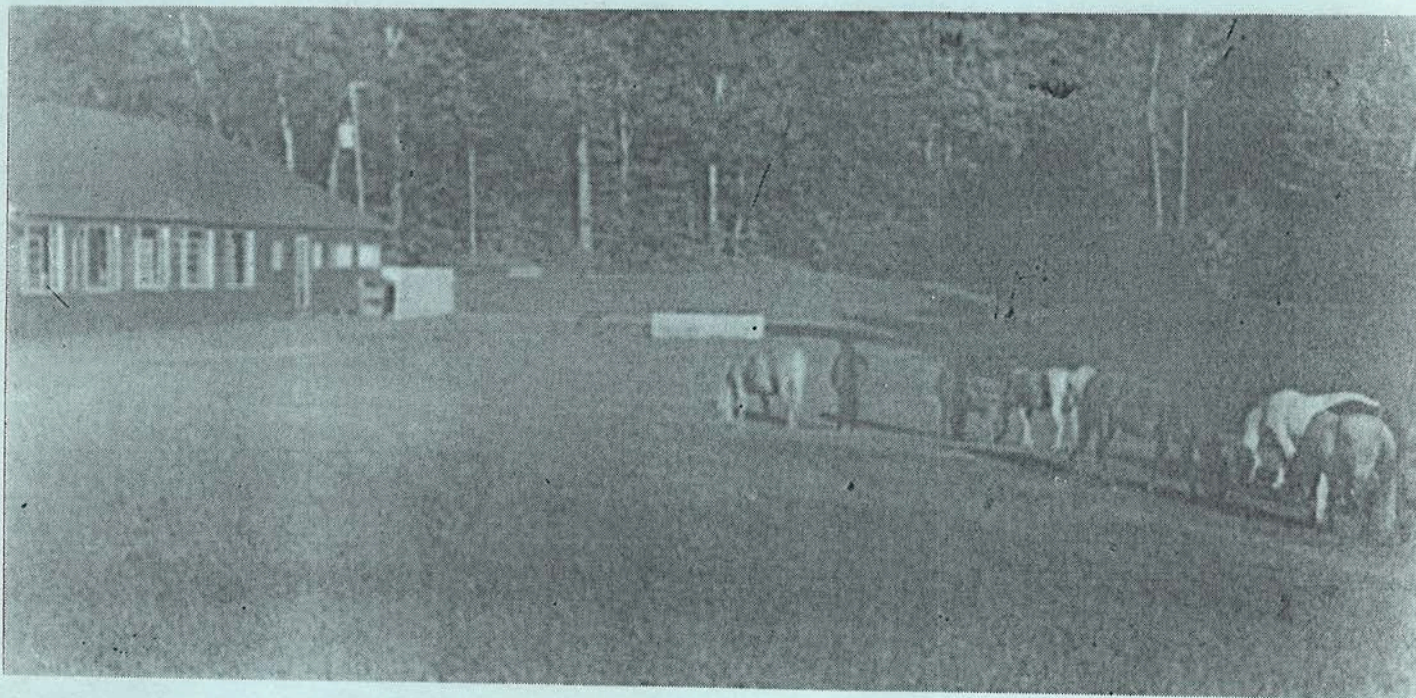
MEET BATTLE CREEK'S DANNY "NEEDS NICKNAME" SHERMAN

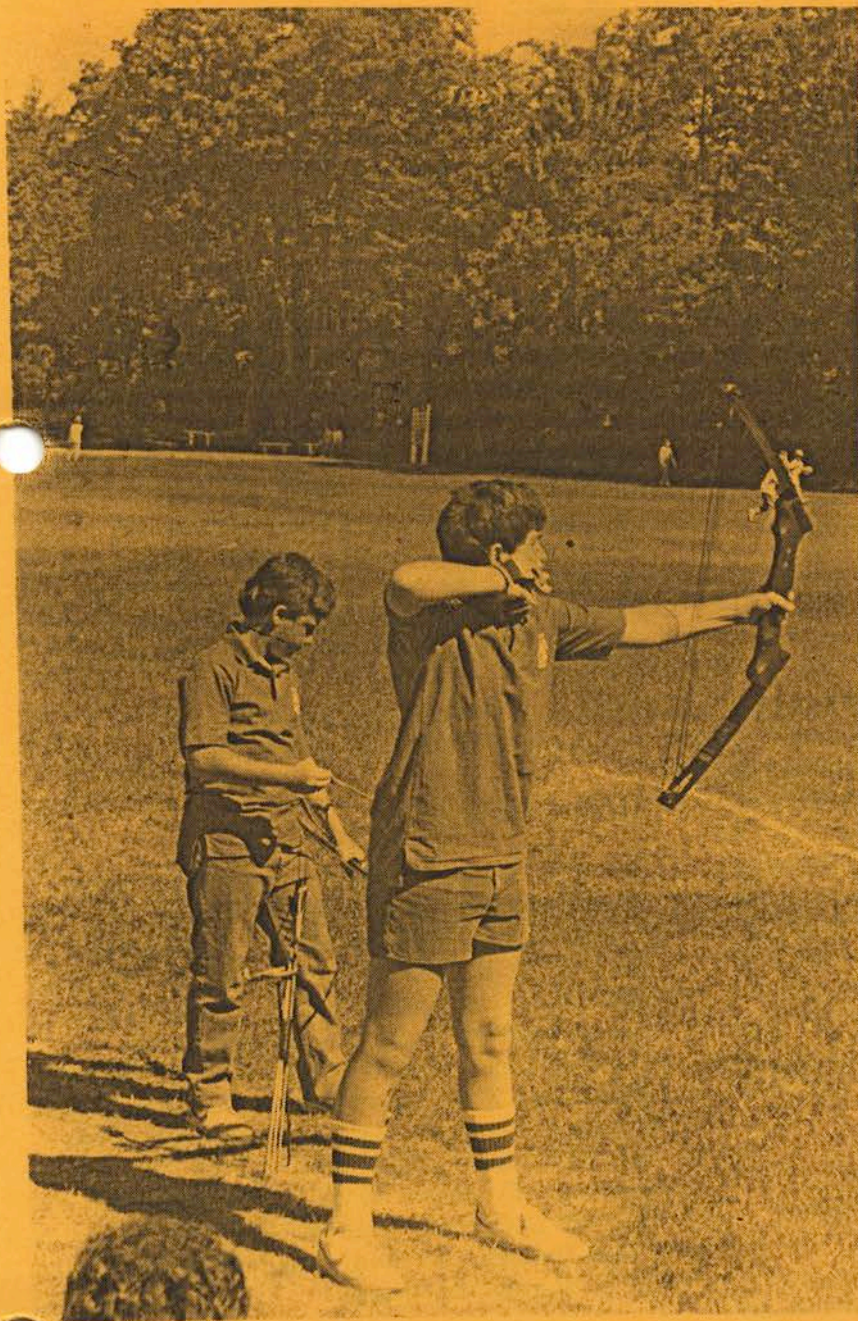

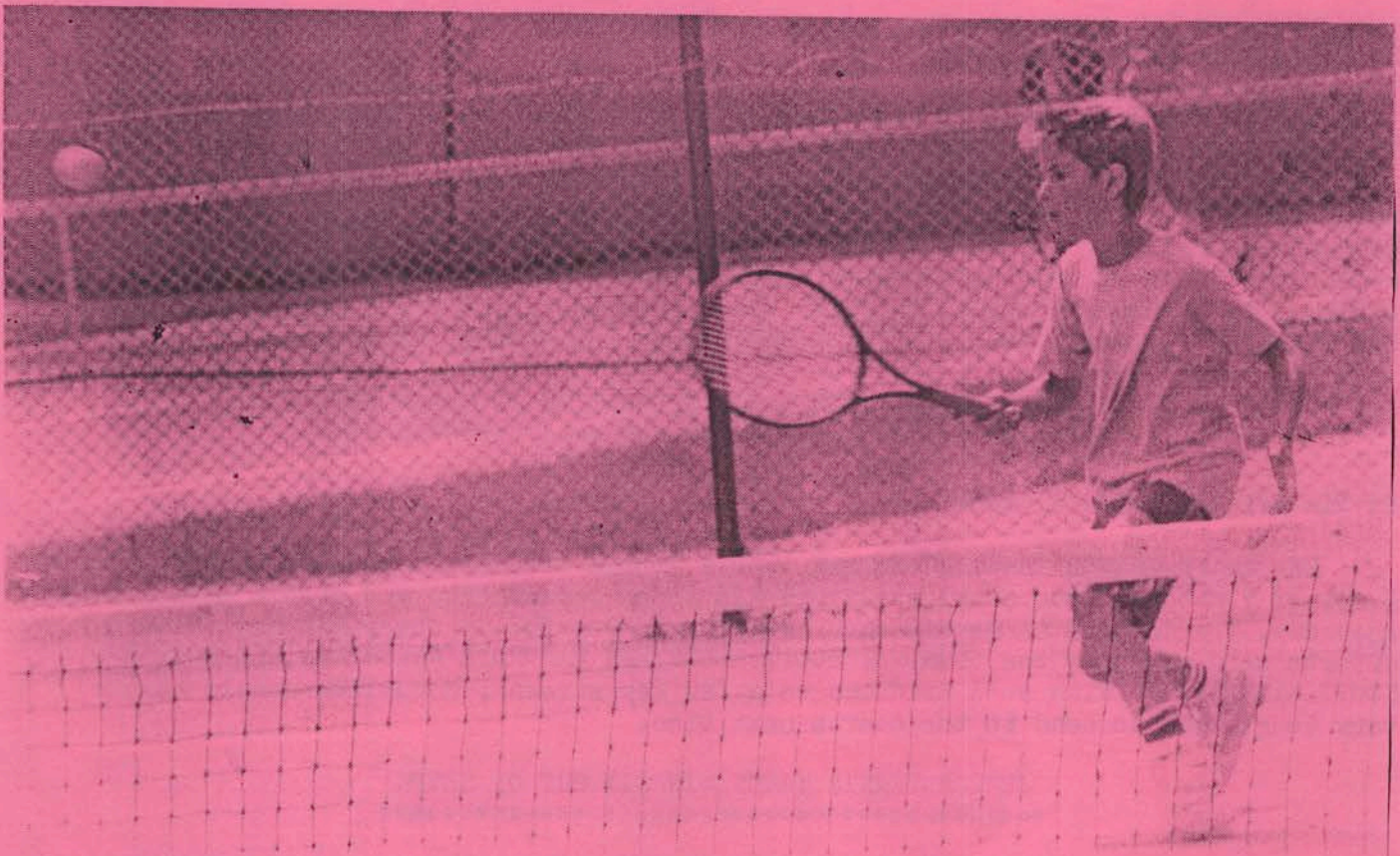
SENIOR HARDBALL TEAM A BIG WINNER

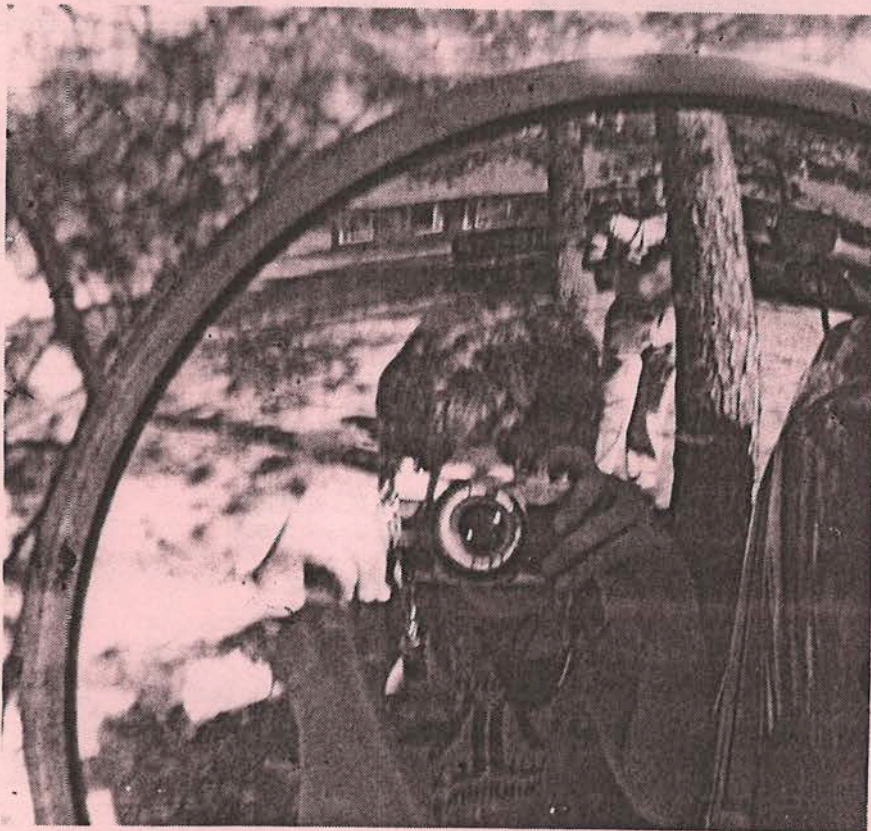

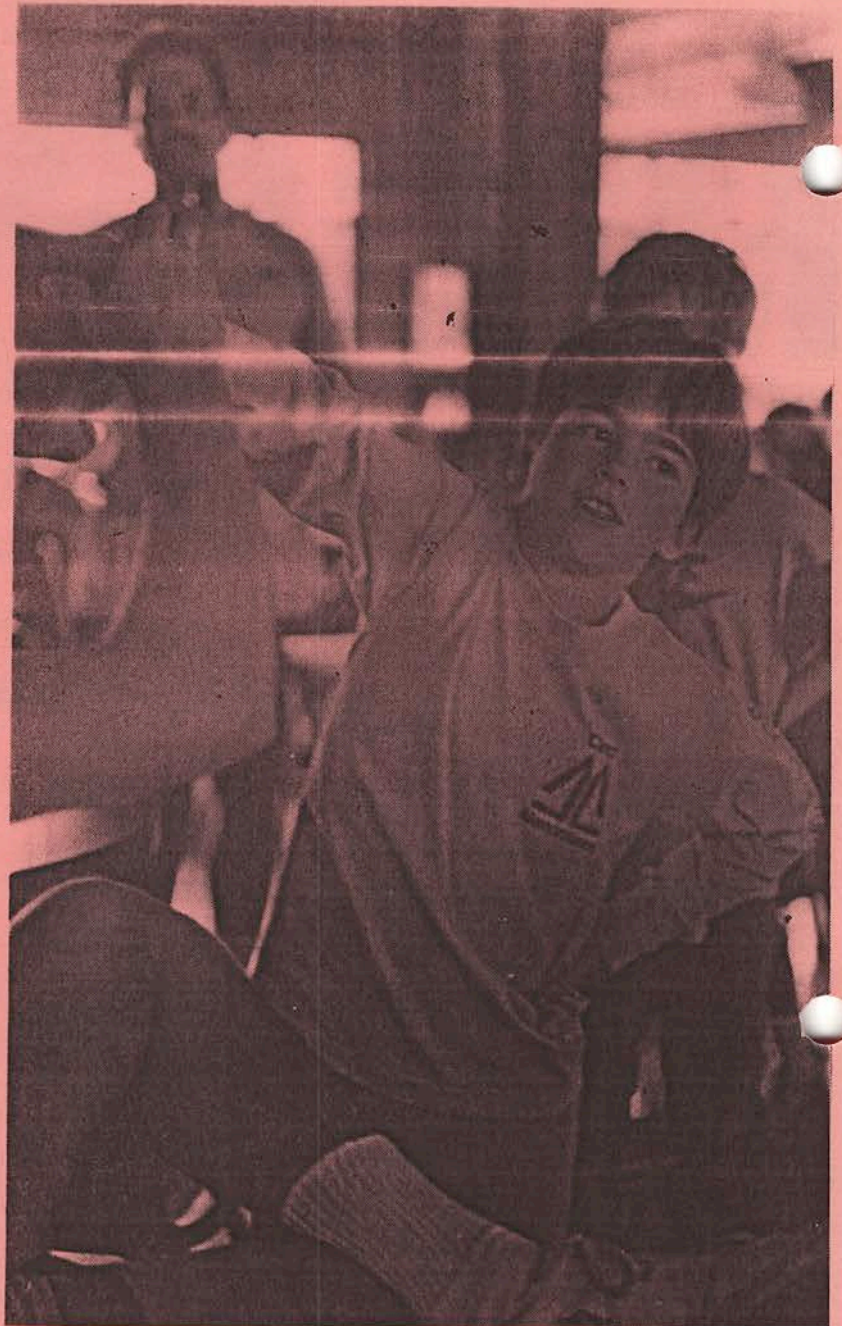

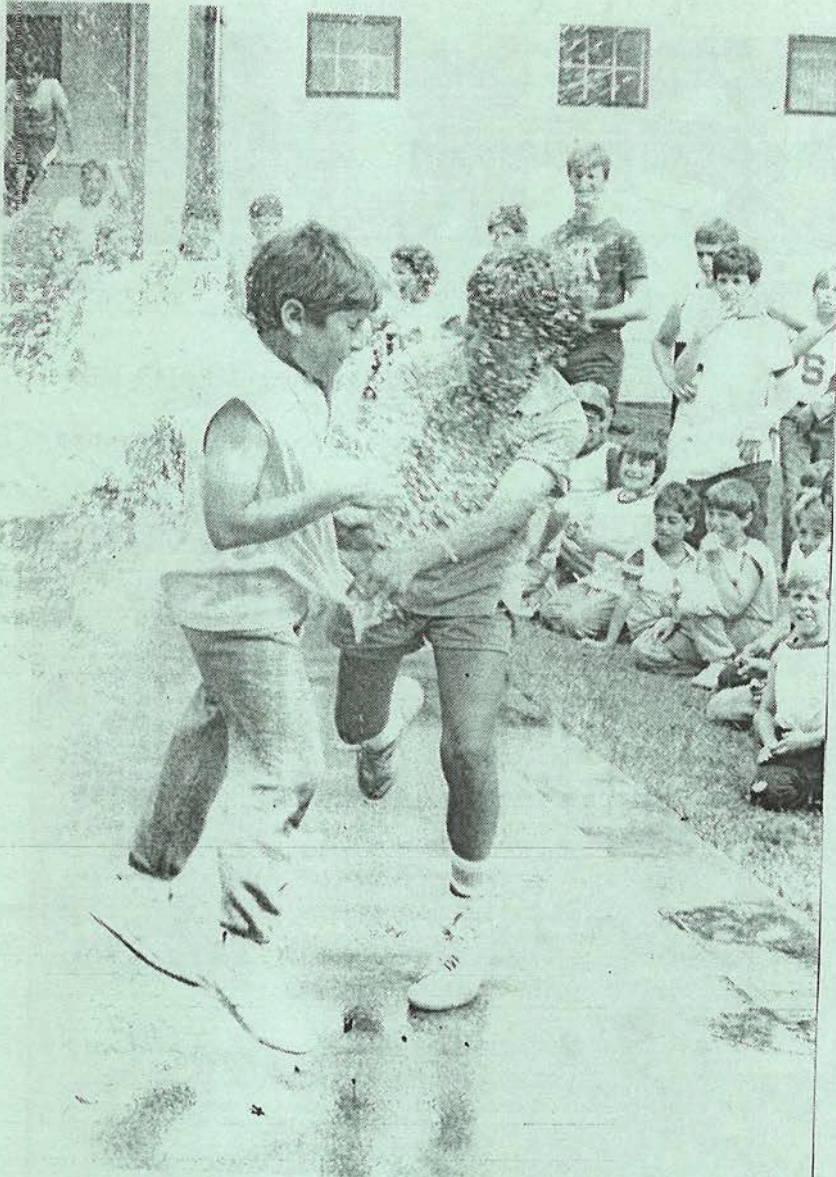
12 & UNDER HANDBALL CHOPS

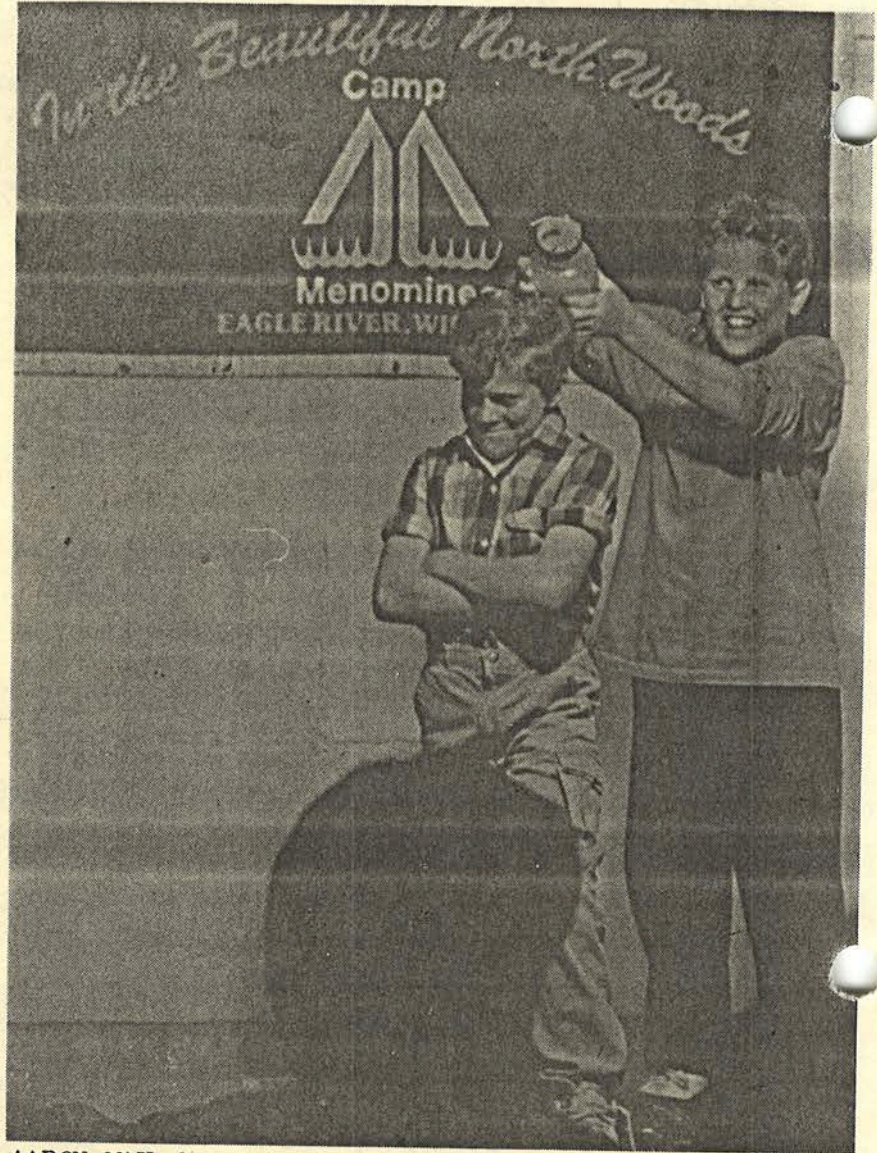

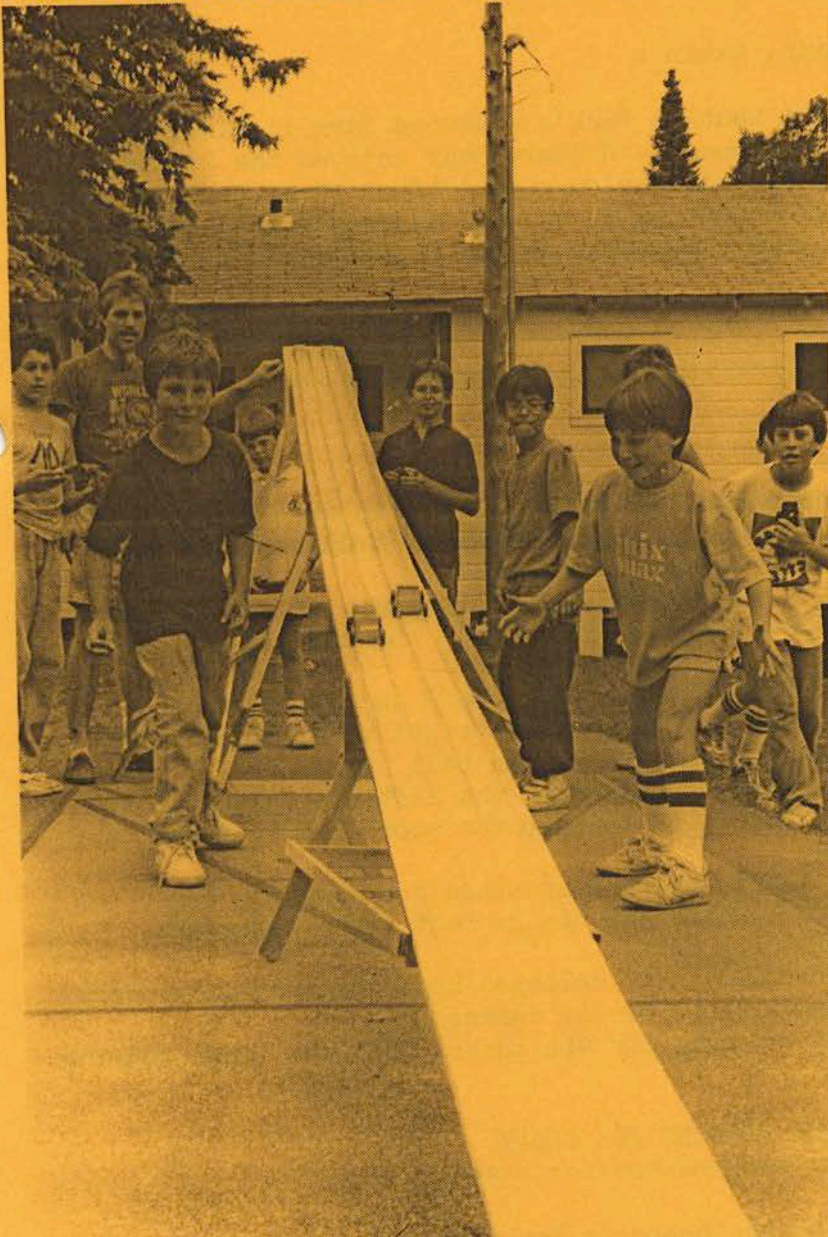

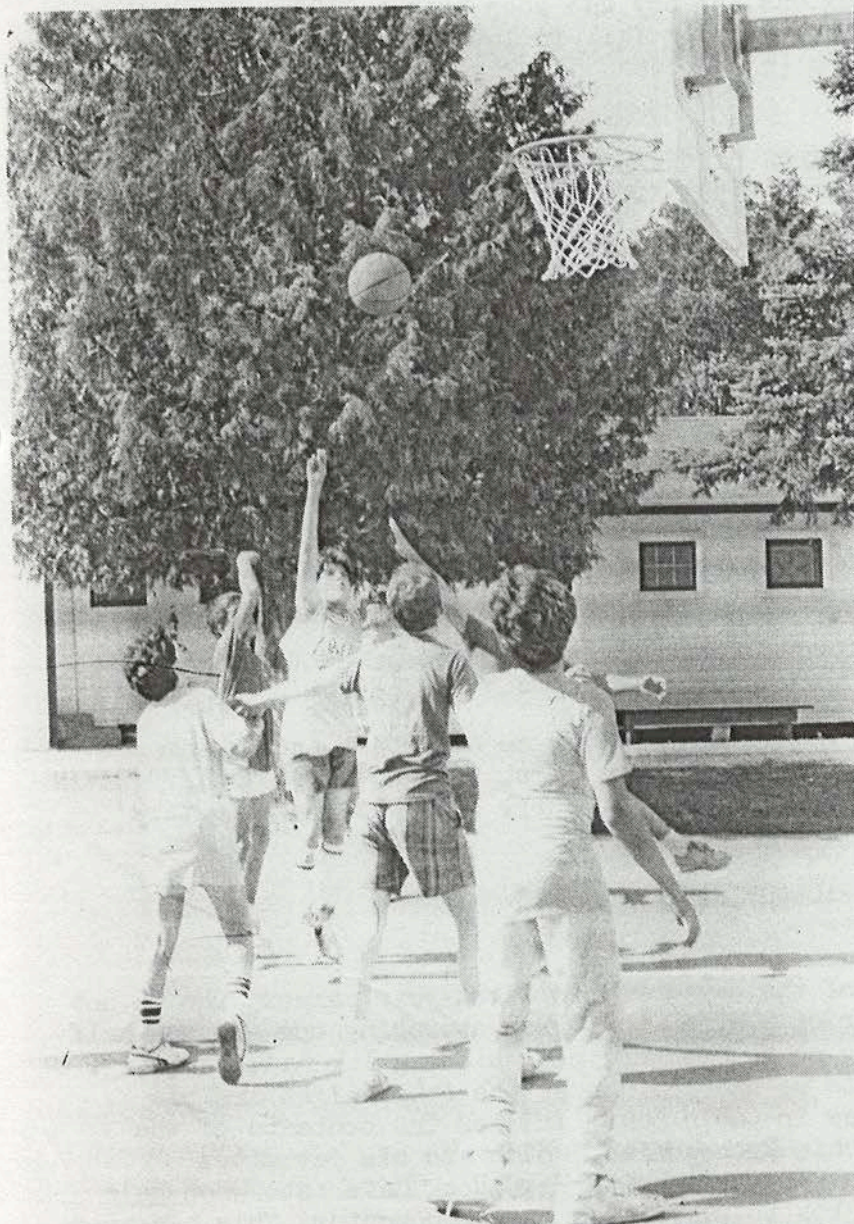

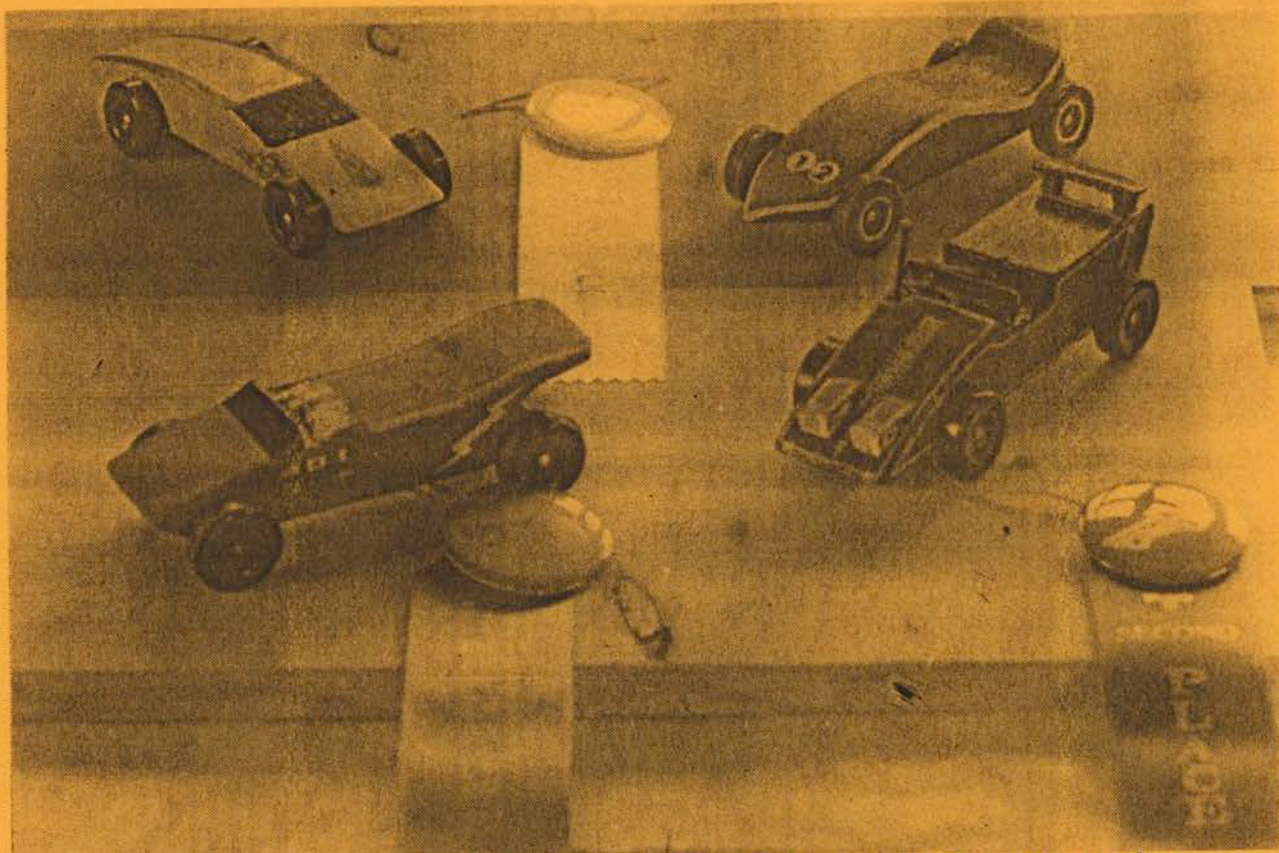

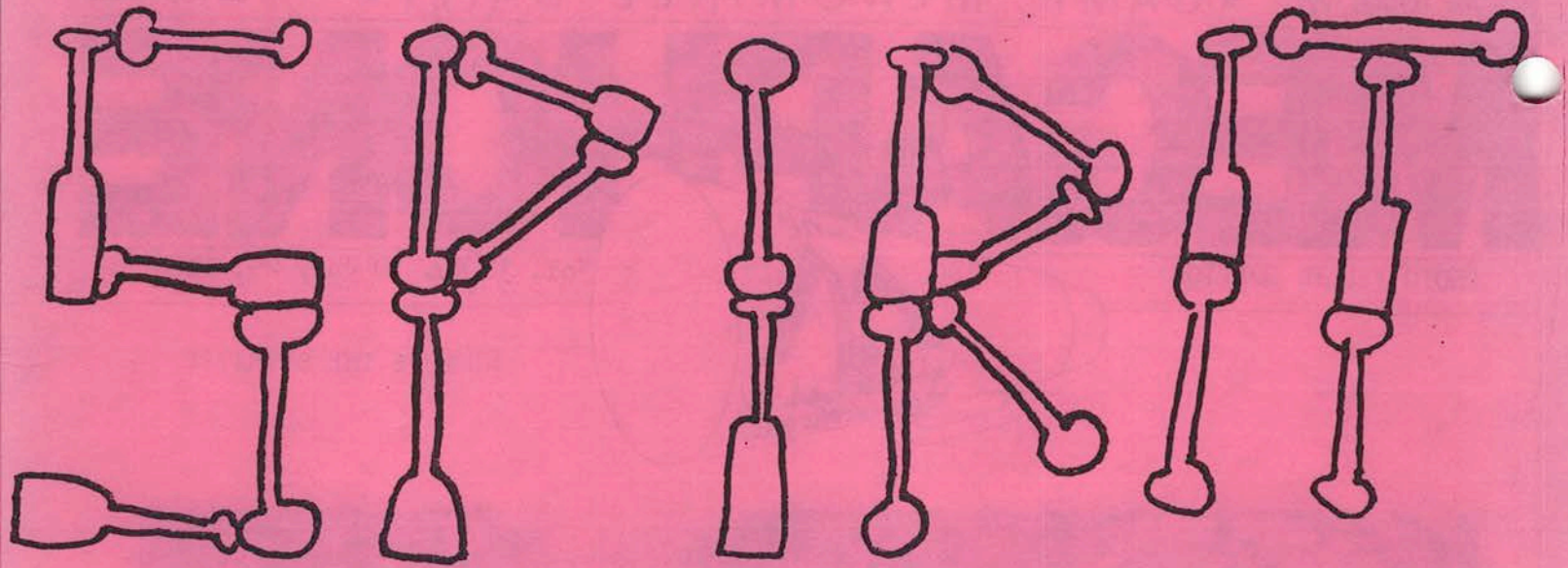

All of the coaches were very impressed that a team with only a limited number of practices could combine to do as well as they did. Special thanks to all who helped with the meet.

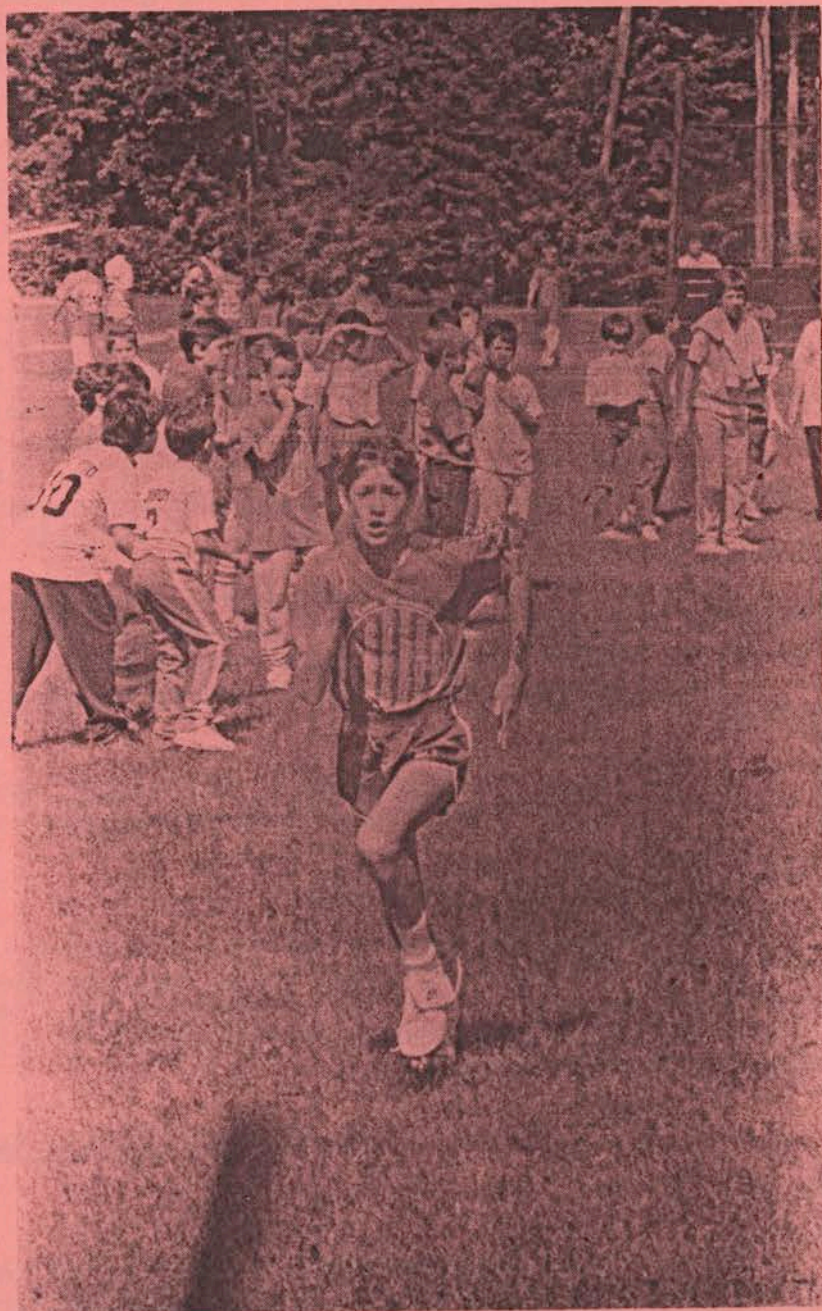

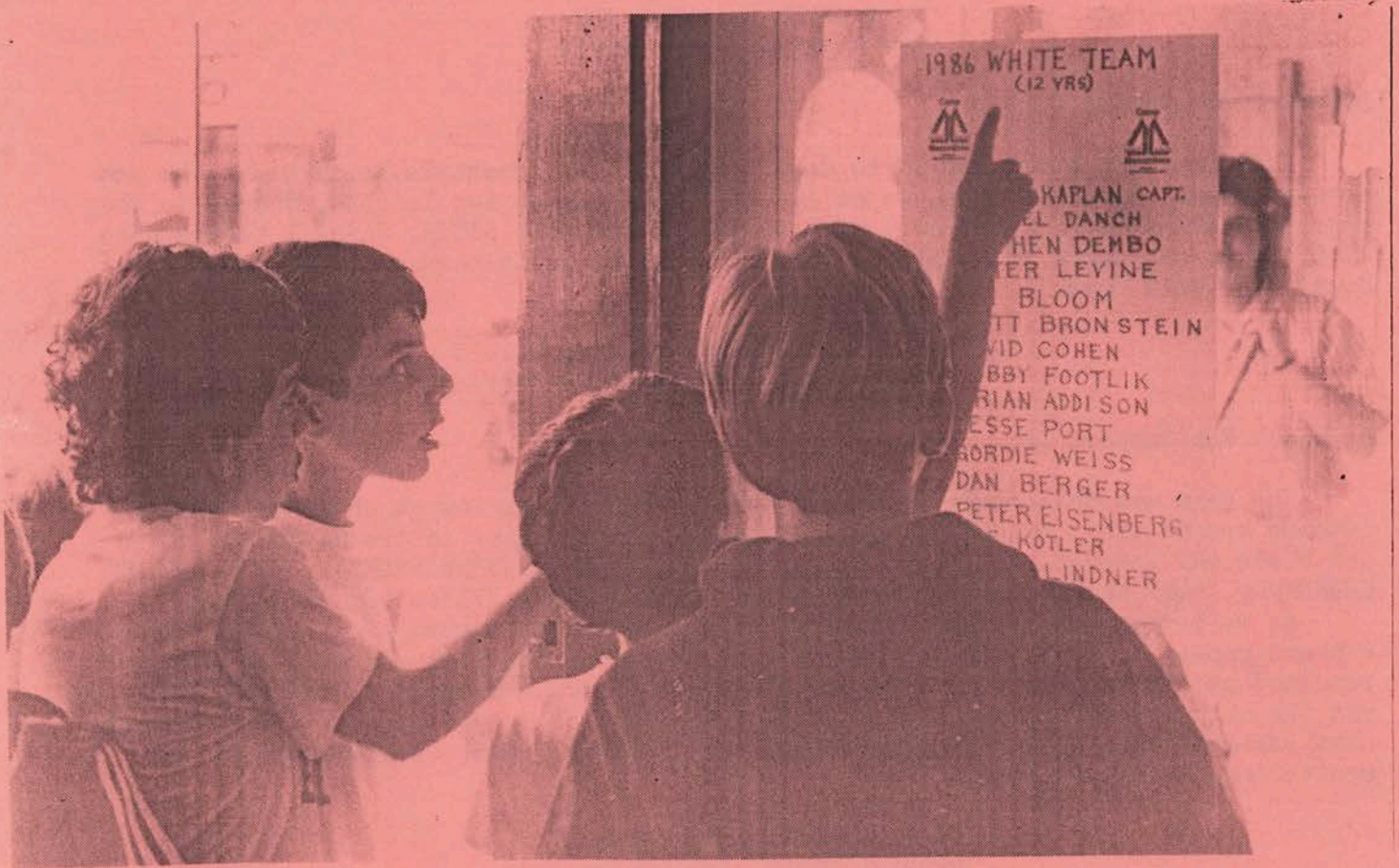

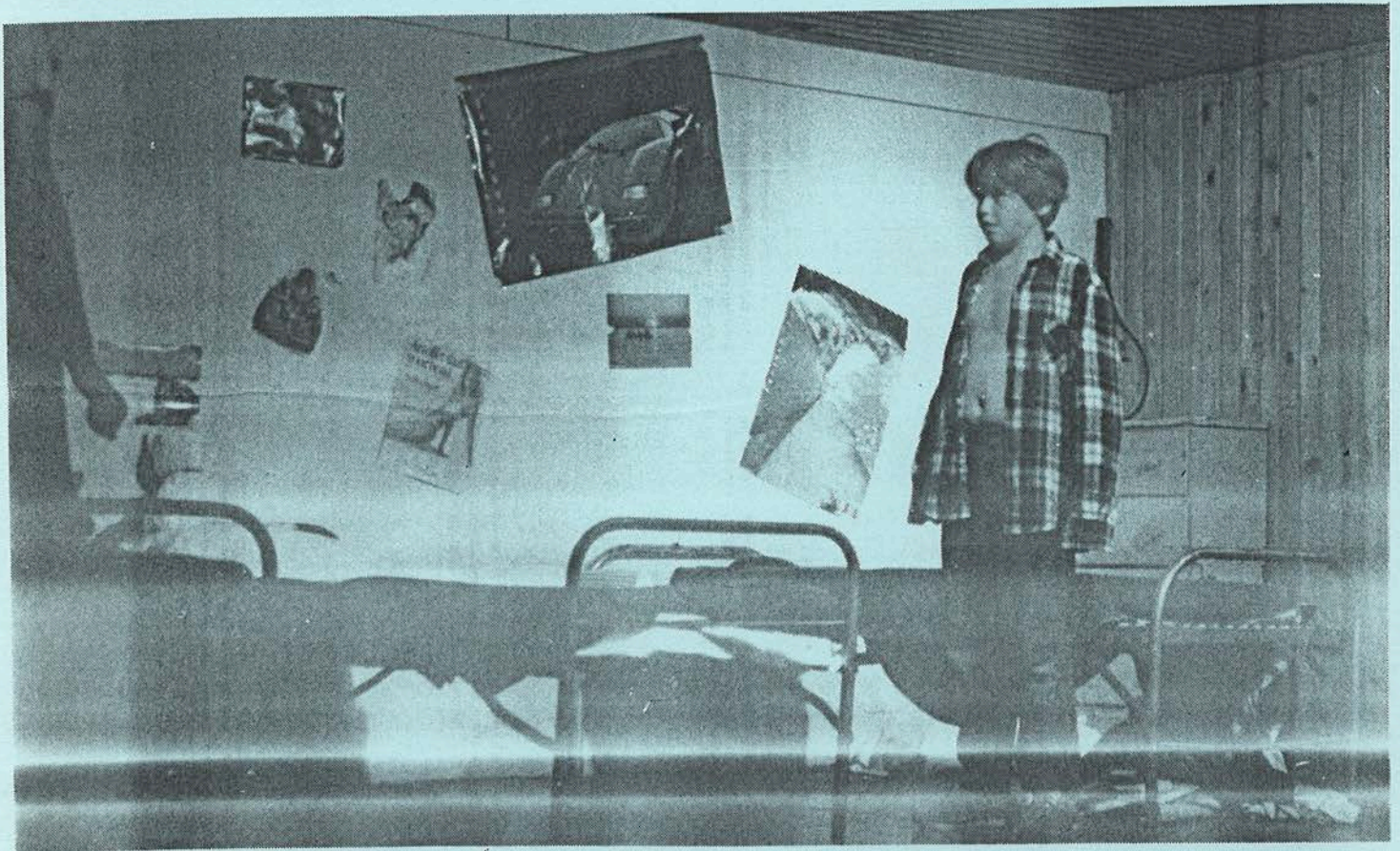
