pitched three sparkling innings of relief.



duels.




A GREAT DAY FOR THE 11 "A" ************************************




needed to finish off the game.






NEIL ROSENGARD set a new Senior Butterfly record, finishing in 12.74 seconds.

team play proved to be too much for the boys from Minocqua.


Coach MICHAEL BUTSCHER commented, "These guys were a pleasure to coach, and it was a pleasure to win."


In the second race, JOEY STEIN and JUDD GOODMAN were able to take first overall. BERNSTEIN and LUSTIG took second. the two other Menominee boats

The third and final intra-camp competition, called Green & White, is now well on its way, after starting out as is tradition, with the All-Camp Hardball Game.



WET SOCIAL AT MARIMETA *******************









They also had a chance on Monday night to watch the eventually-rainedout first-ever night baseball game at Wrigley Field. The cabins were






